#### FIRST DAY.

WEDNESDAY, April 3, 1918.

"Second, That this Conference is in hearty accord with the purposes of the Lyric meeting and regrets that this previous arrangement will prevent its participation in the services. It congratulates the Anti-Saloon League upon the brilliant victory won by the adoption of the Federal Prohibition Amendment by the Maryland Legislation and prays that the time may not be far distant when our country will be under National Prohibition. This Conference, as a part of our great Church, is solidly behind our Government in its stupendous task to make the

world safe for Democracy and will strive to do its part by the infusion of the Spirit of Christ into it to make Democracy safe for the world."

"Therefore, Be it Resolved by the Baltimore Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, That we most earnestly entreat the Governor of Maryland to withhold his approval from any and all legislation that will directly or indirectly commit the State to accepting money from Race Track Gambling; and,

"Be it further Resolved, That we request our Presiding Bishop to name a committee of five ministers and five laymen of our church, resident in Maryland, to present these resolutions to the Governor at 2:30 P. M., Tuesday, April 9, 1918.

"Be it further Resolved, That this Committee shall be authorized to co-operate in freeing Maryland from Race Track Gambling."

## REPORT OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

## RANDOLPH-MACON SYSTEM.

The reports of the several institutions of the Randolph-Macon System are of vital concern to the church. In addition to the statistical part of these reports, for which see answer to minute question 49, we would call attention to the following points of special interest:

The College at Ashland reports an increase of \$47,000 in property value and of \$3,065 in endowment; also that a canvass has begun for 100 scholarships of \$1,000 each, making a total of \$100,000, of which \$36,700 is already promised, including \$35,000 conditionally subscribed by the General Education Board of New York. We give our hearty approval to this undertaking.

The Woman's College reports an increase of \$8,280 in property value and \$3,519 in endowment. It is most interesting to note that 535 students are enrolled in the Y. W. C. A., 8 in the Student Volunteer Movement, 449 in Bible Classes and 420 in Mission Study Classes.

The Academy at Bedford City and the Institute at Danville are doing about their usual work.

The Academy at Front Royal, Va., reports an excellent session, with an enrollment of 147 students, which is an increase of 39 over last year; five ministerial students, four of whom are from the Baltimore Conference. We note that through the efforts of the Field Secretary, the Construction Debt Fund has reached the total of about \$23,500, of which about \$14,500 has been paid. In addition to this there are other subscriptions, amounting to something over \$5,000, conditioned on raising the full amount. The goal is so near that we feel that it must be reached. The most of the Conference has been canvassed and there seems to be but slight hope of doing much more in this way. We, therefore, recommend that an assessment of \$1,500 per year for three years be laid in order to secure the necessary amount.

## UNIVERSITIES.

When the General Conference four years ago appointed a Commission on Education with instructions to organize two universities, one west and the other east of the Mississippi River, it projected the largest educational enterprise ever undertaken by any Church at one time. The report of this Commission was before us and shows that this great work has been accomplished and that at this time the Church is in possession of the Southern Methodist University of Dallas, Texas, and of Emory University of Atlanta, Georgia. Both of these schools have erected buildings which are sufficient to accommodate their patronage at the present time and have a creditable endowment. During the quadrennium about six million dollars have been collected for these two schools. As our interest east of the Mississippi is in Emory University we are pleased to report that this school has now in successful operation

the Departments of Theology, Law, Medicine and Liberal Arts, and that the enrollment of students for the year 1916-1917 was 654. The present progress of this school makes its future an assured success and the plans projected by the Board of Trustees are of such ample proportions both as to buildings and organization that it will more and more appeal to the men of means and vision in our Church. It is of course understood that only a beginning has been made in carrying forward such a great enterprise, and we most heartily call the attention of all our people to their opportunity and responsibility to erect within the bounds of our Church a school of higher learning equal to any of the great universities of this country.

#### SOUTHERN SEMINARY SYSTEM.

We have had reports from the Southern Seminary System, which show that in these trying times these institutions are up to their usual standard. We recommend them to the patronage of our people and at the same time urge the management to measure up to the expectations and requirements of our Church.

#### MINISTERIAL SUPPLY AND TRAINING.

From the communication of the General Conference Board of Education to this Conference, we adopt with approval these sentiments:

"In the great task of conserving and reorganizing the spiritual values of our civilization, the Church must play its part. In doing this no agency of the Church would seem to be more important than its schools, colleges and universities. Therefore, at whatever sacrifice we must equip them, endow them and patronize them."

The General Board also proposes to arrange for an Educational Conference for the whole Church and we recommend that provision be made for the expenses of a representative of this Conference out of the Conference Expense Fund, said representative to be selected by our Conference Board of Education.

We are glad to note that provision for aiding candidates for the ministry in securing adequate educational preparation is steadily gaining the place it deserves in the convictions and the policy of the whole Church. Our Conference is now furnishing such aid to 16 men, all of whom are proving worthy of such assistance in both student life and work. In addition to these a few others are in preparation at other approved institutions. In order that this work of Ministerial Supply and Training may become a matter of interest to the Church at large as well as to those who attend our District Conference, where this cause is usually presented, we recommend that when the annual sermon on the call to the ministry is preached, contributions to this cause be asked for.

Dr. H. P. Hamill, Sec.-Treas. of Ministerial Supply and Training, submitted the following financial statement for the year, which has been duly examined by the Auditing Committee and found to be correct:

Newman, Rev. H. H. Sherman, Rev. J. C. Hawk and Rev. J. W. Smith, as the Committee on Ministerial Supply and Training, with the usual duties.

We recommend the appointment of the usual Visiting Committees to the Southern Seminary System; also the approval of Dr. J. H. Wells and Col. James P. Woods as Trustees of Randolph-Macon College, in the places of Bishop A. W. Wilson and Ed. S. Conrad, respectively.

## REPORT OF THE BOARD OF CHURCH EXTENSION.

### 1

#### *General Board of Church Extension.*

The Secretary of the General Board of Church Extension, Rev. W. F. McMurry, D.D., has submitted to your Conference Board the report for the year ending March 31, 1917, and also for the Quadrennium.

It is gratifying to note that there has been substantial gain on assessments each year. The average being over \$17,000.00 for the last three years, and we confidently believe this year will exceed them all. During the same period receipts on specials have been equally gratifying. In 1915 they were over \$15,000; 1916, about \$57,000, and last year about \$70,000.

### 2.

#### *General Loan Fund.*

At the beginning of the Quadrennium our Loan Fund had passed the half-million mark and the goal was fixed at \$1,000,000 within the next four years. The same substantial gain is shown here as on assessments. In 1915 over \$110,000; 1916, over \$133,000; 1917, \$171,000, and before this time we feel sure the \$1,000,000 mark has been reached.

### 3.

#### *The Assessment.*

The assessment on the Baltimore Conference for the present year was \$9,540 and the special for the Representative Church in Washington City was \$2,000, making a total of \$11,540; 10 churches asked aid amounting to \$4,450, and 3 parsonages amounting to \$700.00 Total asked for. \$5,150.00.

We paid on assessment last year 75% and are happy to report that this year we paid 81%, a gain of 6%. A total gain for 1918 of \$2,244.00.

After setting aside \$1,500.00 for the Representative Church and remitting \$4,250.00 to the General Board, the Conference Board had \$4,025.00 to appropriate, which is \$422.00 more than we had one year ago.

## 4.

*The Baltimore Conference Loan Fund.*

The Baltimore Conference Loan Fund celebrates its first anniversary at this Conference with contributions amounting to \$1,514.00. We have made our first loan to one of our churches where the church was saved and the people heartened. We are convinced that a loan to a congregation is often as good, and sometimes better for them, than a donation and believe that when our people know of this Loan Fund and its great worth it will be substantially increased.

## 5

*Literature.*

*The Bishop A. W. Wilson Memorial Volume*, prepared by Rev. C. D. Harris, D.D., of this Conference is just off the press. Every pastor in this Conference will want this record of the life of our great Bishop, and we are glad to report that a copy of this book will be given free to every pastor who secures Church Extension assessment in full.

## 6

*We Recommend—*

(a) That the assessment for Church Extension be the same as last year: \$9,540.00 and \$2,000.00 for the Representative Church, Washington City. Total, \$11,540.00.

(b) That Church Extension representatives be heard in all our District Conferences and other gatherings where the cause should be presented.

(c) That we request the business manager of the "*Baltimore Southern Methodist*" to give space this year to special articles emphasizing such phases of Church Extension as need to be stressed in this Conference.

(d) That the Church Extension Anniversary meeting be held Wednesday evening during Conference next year.

## REPORT OF THE EPWORTH LEAGUE BOARD.

The Epworth League Board of the Baltimore Conference desires to submit the following report:

We are rejoiced that throughout the Church there is a gain, as reported by the Central Office, in the number of Chapters of 96, and in the number of members of nearly 5,000.

The *Epworth Era* now has more than 26,000 paid up subscribers. This fine young peoples' periodical has been placed gratuitously in all the army and navy encampments both in France and America, and will be put on every war vessel in the near future. After paying all expenses in the way of production, salaries of Editor and his assistant it comes within \$750 of being self-supporting.

There has been a gratifying increase in the Anniversary Day offerings; yet there are many leagues that make no report. This should not be so.

The work in our own Conference is marked by signal advance. Our Conference surpasses all other Conferences in our Church in Epworth League work in proportion of 12 to 7. There are yet a number of charges and churches that have no Epworth Leagues. We have 693 congregations in our Conference, while we have leagues only in proportion to congregations of 1 to 2¼.

In our Conference 12 per cent of our Church membership belongs to the League, while throughout the Church at large only 7 per cent of the Church membership is to be found in the League. Losses throughout the Church of our young people who join the Church on profession of faith is in proportion of 11 to 8; while in our Conference it is approximately 1 to 2. Does the very great superiority of the Baltimore Conference in conserving the young membership arise from the fact that the Baltimore Conference surpasses the rest of the Church in League work in proportion of 12 to 7?

We commend to our pastors the Baltimore Conference Epworth League and urge a greater co-operation with the leaders of this army of young people.

We recommend that all our Chapters elect their officers in April as the new constitution provides.

We rejoice in the success of the African Special for Missions and urge all our Leagues to have a part in this great work.

We request the Editor of the *Baltimore Southern Methodist* to continue the courtesy extended us in granting a page of the paper for League news; the committee on Public Worship of next session of our Conference to grant us Saturday evening of Conference week for our Board Anniversary.

We urge every Chapter to send delegates to the League Conference in Roanoke, Virginia, June 25-28, 1918, and to the Institute at Lake Junaluska, North Carolina, July 14-21, 1918.

## REPORT OF THE BIBLE BOARD.

The year 1917 will live in history as the year when our Nation entered the great European War. Its shadows fell upon us April 6; and the end is not yet.

Its effect upon religious work has been a double one. It has completely paralyzed, or greatly hindered, missionary operations in various parts of the world, and on the other hand there are signs of promise in the quickening of the heart and conscience of the world, and men and nations seem more willing to hear God Himself speak.

Under these extraordinary circumstances, the American Bible Society, in common with its sister societies, has ground for deep thankfulness to God. On the whole, in spite of war and rumors of wars, this fine art of peace—the circulation of the Scriptures—has gone forward without serious hindrance. The issue of the Society has again increased both in the United States and in foreign lands, and there are many evidences of a quickening desire for the Bible throughout the world. That army is already defeated whose ammunition trains are empty. All denominations of Christians should know that the Bible societies are their own, and are entitled to their increasing gifts and prayers. The Bible distribution must show more rapid progress and more wonderful results in enlightening the race than have yet been seen. For the Book which this Society diffuses is assigned the mission to uproot enmity between individuals and between nations, that all things may work together for good to the glory of God Most High. It is gratifying to know that our collections for this worthy cause have been increased this year more than fifty per cent. We urge upon our preachers and laymen the importance of this great work.

*Therefore, Be It Resolved, First,* That the Baltimore Conference of the M. E. Church, South, offers its gratitude to God for the results of over one hundred years of existence and effort of the American Bible Society.

*Resolved, Second,* That our preachers in taking these collections make special appeal for the Khaki Testament for our army and navy men. And that this Conference authorize a division of the receipts equally between the regular work and the army and navy fund.

*Resolved, Third,* That the members of the Bible Board of each District be requested to represent this cause at their respective District Conference.

*Resolved, Fourth,* That contributions for the American Bible Society be taken not later than the month of September, and all monies collected for this cause be sent promptly to the Treasurer of the Board, Mr. N. R. Roberts, Kearneysville, West Virginia.

*Resolved, Fifth,* That should there be a sufficient reason for any congregation or individual contributing directly to an agent or local organization, a receipt shall be taken and sent to the Treasurer of the Board.

*Resolved, Sixth,* That all reports shall be in if possible by the first day of the Conference session.

REPORT NO. 4—BOARD OF MISSIONS.

The General Board of Missions reports that for the first time in sixteen years it is entirely out of debt, that its income this year is \$200,000 in excess of last year, and that this has been the best year in its history.

The assessments from the General Board for the coming year are: Foreign Missions, \$15,900; Home Missions, \$5,088.

The assessment for Conference Missions is \$15,561.

CENTENARY.

The year 1919 marks the one hundredth year of American Methodist Missions. It has been planned to celebrate this Centenary Anniversary throughout the bounds of American Methodism.

The Centenary movement of American Methodist Missions is under the direction of a joint commission created by the M. E. Church and the

M. E. Church, South. Each Church has a commission under which it does its own planning and adopts its own methods of procedure. The aim of the movement is the deepening of the spiritual life, the broadening and quickening of the prayer life, and the arousing of the Church to responsibility in stewardship. Through this movement we expect our people to rise to the greatness of the present opportunity, and lay upon the altar of the Lord an offering of more than one hundred million dollars. A committee of one hundred of the leading laymen of our Church fixed our financial responsibility at thirty-five millions for the next five years.

The plans and methods for the successful accomplishment of these results are being perfected, and missionary secretaries are being appointed in all the Conferences to give all of their time to this work for the next two years, their salaries to be paid by the General Board of Missions.

We as a Conference heartily approve of this great movement and pledge our co-operation.

#### NOMINATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS.

We nominate as the Committee on Evangelism the members of the Executive Committee of the Board of Missions, with authority to increase its number if necessary.

We recommend the election of Judge E. D. Newman of Woodstock, Virginia, as Conference Lay Leader.

We recommend to the Bishop for appointment Rev. J. Howard Wells as Conference Missionary Secretary, to fill this office in connection with a pastoral charge.

We recommend to the Bishop for appointment as Missionary Secretary for the Centenary Fund to give all of his time to the work, Rev. H. H. Sherman.

We recommend that all specials throughout the year go through the hands of our Conference Treasurer, Mr. J. E. Alexander, Alexandria, Virginia, that our Conference may get the proper credit.

We recommend that all money raised for missions both by our Churches and our Sunday Schools be sent to our Conference Treasurer at least quarterly.

We recommend the use of the Duplex envelopes by all our Churches in raising the assessments.

We recommend that Friday night of our next Conference be the time for holding the missionary anniversary.

In spite of the abnormal conditions of war times, we are able to chronicle a good year, thus showing that our loyal women continue to "put first things first", although responding generously to the many calls of the day. Without doubt a higher grade of work is being done each year, and it is most gratifying to watch the growth in interest, in perfected organization, in consecrated service, and in a more intimate acquaintance with the work on our mission fields. Our women give "with knowledge".

There has been a net gain of eight organizations; and an increase of \$1,581.63 over the amount sent to the Conference Treasurer the preceding year, a gain of about 10%. While many new members have been reported, a corresponding loss of others, in some cases only apparent because of failure to report, keeps the total roll from showing any gain in membership.

Forty-three auxiliaries have attained to the "Standard of Excellence" and hold places on the Conference Honor Roll; one hundred and fifteen make a systematic study of Christian Stewardship. The Departments of Study and Publicity, Social Service and Supplies contribute their share to the general effectiveness of the auxiliaries.

At the Council Meeting last spring we made a \$6,600 Pledge over and above our Membership Dues, this to be undirected by us except \$250 to two Day Schools. True to tradition, this Pledge was not only paid in full, but was overpaid, this time by \$759.83. Too much cannot be said of the faithful co-operation of auxiliary officers and members in carrying out the plans of the Conference Society, which in turn are based on those of the Woman's Missionary Council.

#### REPORT OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD.

*To the Baltimore Conference, Methodist Episcopal Church, South—*

The Sunday School Board submits the following report:

Statistics of the Sunday Schools of the Conference for the year now closing are not available at the preparation of this report, but the oral reports made by the pastors to the Conference indicate, without exception, continued and increasing interest in the work of the schools and a healthy condition of growth. It is safe to assume that the figures when compiled will show a substantial increase in enrollment.

#### DEFINITE AIMS FOR THE COMING YEAR.

In order that we may have definite objectives during the coming year, the Board has passed resolutions providing for the organization of each Presiding Elder's District after the plan prescribed by the General Sunday School Board and urging the thorough organization of every

Primary Department in the Conference, with the recommendation that every school that has not already introduced the Graded Lessons in its Primary Department shall give the same a thorough examination and trial in that department.

#### FIELD SECRETARY.

Believing that imperative necessity for the employment of a Sunday School Field Secretary for the Conference exists and that though seeming to advance our Sunday School work is, relatively, losing ground, as compared with that of the Conferences where Field Secretaries are employed, the Board has given most earnest consideration to the subject and intends to find, during the year, a man qualified for the position and to ask the Conference, at its next session, to make adequate provision for his financial support.

#### SUNDAY SCHOOL ANNIVERSARY.

The great interest which has attached to our Sunday School Anniversary, which we have been accustomed to hold on Thursday night of the Conference week, justifies us in expressing the desire that the Conference allow us to hold the anniversary that night at the next session.

#### STATISTICS.

The Board has had the pleasure of having with it in its meetings at this Conference, Dr. Chas. D. Bulla, Superintendent of the Wesley Bible Class Department who has brought us, among other things, the latest Sunday School statistics of the Church, not yet published. These statistics are inspiring. Schools, 17,279; Officers and Teachers, 151,792; Pupils, 1,750,179; total enrollment, 1,901,971; increase during the quadrennium, 272,281; Sunday School scholars received into the Church during the quadrennium, 285,690; Wesley Bible Classes (Adult, Young People's, Senior and Intermediate) enrolled with the department, 11,000, with 225,000 members.

#### INSTITUTE WORK IN THE DISTRICTS.

The Board has decided that it will extend adequate financial assistance to institute work in the Districts which shall organize in accordance with the General Board's plan and assist in providing programmes for such institutes.

#### TRAINING SCHOOL FOR LEADERS.

The Training School for Sunday School Leaders will be held at Lake Junaluska July 23 to August 4, 1918. We urge our workers to attend.

## OTHER RECOMMENDATIONS.

We again most strongly urge our Superintendents to organize their Bible Classes and enroll them with the Wesley Bible Class Department; to establish Teacher Training Classes and to hold regular meetings of the Workers' Council.

## CHILDREN'S DAY.

Children's Day offerings have about kept pace with last year. With the substantial advances in other directions, there ought to be large increases in these offerings. Every school is urged to hold a Children's Day service and take an offering as provided by the Discipline. The offering should be sent, as soon as taken, to the Treasurer of the Board, Mr. O. C. Michael, Aberdeen, Maryland. The Board will furnish Children's Day Programmes, without cost, to all schools which take offerings and send them to the Board's Treasurer. They may be ordered through Smith and Lamar, Richmond, Virginia.

## COMMITTEE ON PUBLISHING INTERESTS—REPORT NO. 1.

## ON THE "BALTIMORE SOUTHERN METHODIST".

Your Committee begs leave to make the following report:

Your paper has had another prosperous year. It has reached the largest proportionate circulation of any Conference paper east of the Mississippi; there are two papers west of the Mississippi which have as large a circulation proportionately, but neither claims to exceed that of the "*Baltimore Southern Methodist*". Its circulation is 43% greater than the average circulation of our Conference organs. It also enjoys the distinction of being the only paper in the connection which, during these times of largely increased cost of production, has maintained its subscription price at \$1.00 a year. Even "*The Mission Friend*," the little eight-paged paper, which is the organ of the German Mission Conference, has advanced its price to \$1.25. The Editor and business manager of our paper attributes its large circulation chiefly to the assessment, which has enabled the Company so far to keep the price at \$1.00 a year, and the hearty support which has been accorded the paper by preachers and people. Some other Conferences which have adopted our plan, both as to the assessment and the allotment of the new subscribers to the charges, recognizing the value of these bureaus of publicity, have assumed far larger assessments than ours for their support. Our small assessment should be paid in full, as a guarantee to the future prosperity of our paper.

After making a careful study of the field, we have found no better plan than that which the Conference worked so successfully during the past two years, and which some other Conferences are now using with excellent results.

We therefore recommend:

First, That we repledge our hearty support to the paper, first, by giving due diligence to the assessment, with the understanding that all in excess of the Editor's salary be used to help meet the additional expense, and, second, by employing our best efforts to secure, during a month of the coming year, to be determined by the management, at least a thousand new subscribers to offset the normal losses. We recommend that the Joint Board of Finance distribute the thousand new subscribers on an equitable basis, and that the District Stewards redistribute the number assigned to their districts to the several charges as the minimum. It will be understood that an earnest effort is all that is expected of our preachers, and that any preacher will be without blame if he fails to secure the number allotted to his charge, after such effort has been made. The management of the paper, with the assistance of the Presiding Elders, is authorized to carry these provisions into effect.

Second, That the large number of the paper be continued each month, as long as the financial condition of the Company justifies its publication.

Third, That the assessment be \$3,000 as heretofore ordered by the Conference for other years, and that the price of the paper remain unchanged.

Fourth, That nothing in this report shall be construed as authorizing the Publishing Company to involve the Conference in any debt whatever.

An examination of the report of the Publishing House for the fiscal year ending February 28, 1918, shows the following facts: Net increase in sales, \$111,573.60; net gain, \$153,414.64. Losses on publication of the *Methodist Review*, *Christian Advocate* and *Epworth Era*, \$8,904.82. Total net gain, \$144,509.82. This is a very encouraging showing. We appreciate the presence of the branch House in Richmond, Va., and recommend that our preachers and people give it their liberal patronage.

In these times of excitement and suspense, we urge our pastors to do what they can to increase the circulation of our periodicals among the people, for one of the great needs of the times is to keep the Church of our Lord Jesus Christ ever before our people, for the world needs Christ and His Church for strength and support in these times of peril.

The attention of our people is called to the large variety of tracts now being put out by our Publishing House and to their cheapness and their educational value among our people.

We pray the blessing of God upon our Editors and publishers and pray that the Holy Spirit may guide them in this important interest of our Church.

## REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

We believe that the divinely given Lord's Day, the Christian Sabbath, set apart by the Church and the nation as a day of rest and worship—although not always properly observed—has been one of the greatest bulwarks of the Church and of the nation and conducive to physical, moral and spiritual strength to the individual.

The horrible conditions of warfare as they exist today can be attributed to the neglect of study and application of the great moral and ethical laws contained in the Word of God, among which, emphasis is placed upon the command, "Remember the Sabbath Day to Keep it Holy". We deplore the fact that said commandment is not as generally observed today as it was by the earlier settlers of our nation, and we would suggest, "Remove not the ancient land-mark, which thy fathers have set." We recommend co-operation with all Churches and other organizations so far as that co-operation will administer to this end.

We especially commend the great aims and accomplishments of the Lord's Day Alliance of Maryland, and the self-sacrificing devotion of its leaders in visiting and assisting religious organizations in this work, and especially their influence with the Maryland Legislature in bringing about the defeat of four Sunday Base Ball Bills and one Sunday Concert Bill, and in accordance with their request we recommend that the Presiding Elders of the Baltimore, Washington and Moorefield Districts appoint one clerical and one lay representative each from their respective districts to represent our Church in Maryland, and co-operate with the Lord's Day Alliance. We commend our President, the Hon. Woodrow Wilson, upon his noble proclamation to the United States Army, with reference to the sanctity of the Sabbath and the refraining from doing unnecessary work upon the Lord's Day in this time of crisis—yet it has come to our attention that at some of our army cantonments certain amusements are allowed on the Lord's Day, that are not conducive to the moral and spiritual uplift of our young men, and the proper observance of the day, and we deplore this fact, and trust that nothing in the form of amusement or of unnecessary work be permitted that will detract from the sanctity of the Sabbath as commanded in the Mosaic Law and exemplified by our Lord Jesus Christ.

We recommend that all our preachers and laymen discourage the practice existing in some localities of making the Sabbath a day of convenience for funeral services. We would have them discourage the distribution of ordinary mail and Sunday newspapers, and also such diversions and social engagements as interfere with attendance upon the ministry of the Word from the pulpit, in the Sunday School, Epworth Leagues, Class Meetings, Prayer Meetings, or other gatherings for the purpose of the study of the Word of God, and the development of Christian character.

We, therefore, recommend that a thorough study of the subject engage the best thought of the ministry and membership of the Church, and

that after earnest prayer to Almighty God for His guidance, we use the time and means necessary to secure for the Church and the nation a more profitable observance of the Lord's Day, and we also recommend that all the pastors preach at least twice a year upon the subject of Sabbath Observance.

We rejoice that our Congress has at last submitted to the States a national prohibition constitutional amendment, and already eleven of the States that have had an opportunity to vote on the matter have ratified the amendment. #### *Resolved—*

1. That we hereby place our Church in West Virginia squarely behind the movement that shall without doubt land our Mountain State in the right column.
2. That we express appreciation of the action of the Secretary of the Navy and Secretary of War by which the saloon has been closed in the City of Annapolis and protective measures thrown around our young men in the cantonment.
3. That we call upon our Senators and Representatives in the Congress of the United States to enact into law a measure that shall prohibit the manufacture, sale, importation, exportation and transportation of intoxicating liquors to be used as a beverage anywhere under the Stars and Stripes during the period of the war.
4. That we endorse the work of the Anti Saloon League under its most efficient management in Maryland, Virginia and West Virginia, and pray that the blessing of God shall so rest upon this organization that very soon we shall see the dawning of the saloonless day for which we are all praying.

REPORT OF THE VISITORS TO THE MARYLAND GENERAL  
HOSPITAL.

Your committee appointed to visit the Maryland General Hospital of Baltimore has done so and desires to make the following report:

We were much pleased with the physical appearance of the interior of the Hospital. There has been an almost complete transformation. Heretofore only about sixty per cent. of the Hospital space was available, but during the year the old amphitheatre was converted into a number of rooms and one ward, so that now every part of space is utilized.

Of the one hundred and fifty thousand dollars secured a little over a year ago in subscriptions covering a period of four years, already one hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars have been paid.

We are also glad to state that because of the increase in the number of rooms and the more efficient management the Hospital is now on a paying basis. The Methodists of the Baltimore Conference may feel justly proud in being connected with such an institution.

We recommend that our Conference sympathetically co-operate with the Methodist Hospital Association in its work in every way possible, but without in any way incurring any financial obligations thereby, or becoming responsible for its management in any sense that would bind our Annual Conference legally, financially or morally.

We request the preachers of the Conference to commend the Hospital to our people for their patronage, and that each pastoral charge at the discretion of the pastor observe one Sabbath in the year to be known as "Hospital Sunday," and the sacramental collection of that day be given to the Hospital Association.

## MEMOIRS

### THOMAS WILLIAM BROWN.

Rev. Thomas William Brown, son of Samuel and Mary Brown, was born in Snickersville, Loudoun County, Virginia, August 16, 1837, and died at his home, Gardenville, Baltimore County, Maryland, July 30, 1917.

Brother Brown was the son of a local Methodist preacher, and had all the advantages of an early Christian training. He first attended school in his home county, later his parents moved to Ohio, and while there he attended higher institutions of learning and completed his education.

When a young man the family returned to their native state, Virginia, and the records of the fourth quarterly Conference of Winchester station show that "T. W. Brown having proved himself worthy is hereby authorized to exercise his gifts and graces as a local preacher in the Methodist Episcopal Church, South." This license is dated October 24, 1857, and is signed by Rev. George H. Ray, Chairman, and William Denny, Secretary. Soon afterwards he joined the Baptist Church and entered its ministry.

In 1861-64 he served Rock Creek Circuit, which is composed of Emory Church, Washington, D. C., and Andrew Chapel, the first Southern Methodist Church in Maryland. The new stone structure of West Franklin Ave., Gardenville, takes the place of the old frame church on Southern Avenue. In 1864 Brother Brown was called to the pastorate of the Congregational Methodist Church, Washington, D. C., then M. Street, now Mt. Vernon Place Church. The records show he has not been ordained yet and desires ordination at the hands of the church of which he was a member.

The following paper found among his possessions is of interest: "This certifies that Rev. Thomas W. Brown, upon call of the Congregational Methodist Church of Washington, D. C., and after giving to us as well as to that church, satisfactory evidence of an evangelical experience and a call to the ministry was with our concurrence and co-operation set apart by ordination to the work of the Gospel Ministry, as pastor of said Church on this Lord's Day, the thirty-first of July, 1864, A. D. Signed: G. A. Simpson, minister of the Baptist denomination." During his pastorate here M Street Church was built. When the day of dedication came, to test the loyalty of the leaders, someone caused the flag to be placed over the door of the main entrance. Dr. Sampson, who was to preach this sermon entered by the rear door while Thomas W. Brown marched in under the flag.

The Conference of 1867 met in Baltimore, and here on March 8, Brother Brown applied for admission. A serious question was raised as to receiving him as he had been ordained to eldership according to the usages of the Baptist Church. His reply was: "Take me as I am or not at all." He was received and served the following charges: 1868-70, St. Mary's; 1870-72, Shenandale Mission; 1872-73, Berkeley Springs; 1873-77, Taylor's Circuit; 1877-81, Kent Circuit; 1881-82, Hyattsville; 1882-86, Freedom; 1888-90, Fincastle; 1890-94, Luray; 1894-96, Elkton; 1896-99, Lewisburg. At the Conference held in Washington, D. C., April, 1899, Brother Brown superannuated. He married Mary Helen Biddison February 3, 1863. God gave to them one son, Alpheus Wilson Brown, and two daughters, Mrs. Mary A. Clark and Mrs. Ella J. Cauffman.

Lewisburg, W. Va., was Brother Brown's last appointment, and from there he moved to Gardenville on Taylor's Circuit, where he had found his bride nearly fifty years before, and where he had spent eight years as pastor. Here he lived quietly for 19 years. On February 3, 1913, they celebrated their fiftieth anniversary.

The last two years of his life were marked by intense suffering. After services at his home conducted by his pastor, Rev. G. G. Oliver, assisted by Rev. G. Dorsey White, Rev. E. F. Fielding and Rev. W. H. Best, he sleeps in the Biddison burying ground and waits the resurrection of the last day.

The writer has known Brother Brown for the past fourteen years. He doubts if any man knew him more intimately or understood him better in late years. No one ever had any doubt as to where he stood on any question. He was a man of few words and deep conviction. He was a student—he studied to know the truth and never entered the pulpit without the most careful preparation. His sermons were forceful and finished. A man of the old school is gone.

"Jesus, thou Prince of life,  
Thy chosen cannot die:  
Like Thee, they conquer in the strife,  
To reign with Thee on high."

### WILLIAM LEE SMITH.

At the close of a beautiful day in October, 1917, just as the sun was sinking to rest, the Rev. William Lee Smith was translated into the presence of his Lord. The earthly ministry which he thus peacefully and triumphantly completed was in part an inheritance, for he was born in the parsonage at Charles Town, West Virginia, December 19, 1866, being the child of Rev. Robert and Mary Smith. In due course of time, the mantle of the father appears to have fallen upon the son.



The early years of his life were spent in many places, as his parents moved from charge to charge in the itinerant ministry of the Church. Nothing out of the ordinary entered into his experience until at the age of fifteen he was genuinely converted to God, in the old church at Manassas, Virginia.

Almost coincident with his conversion came the call to preach—a deep and abiding conviction that he was set apart for the ministry of the Word—and six years later at White Sulphur Springs, under the Presiding Eldership of the Rev. H. W. Kinzer, he asked for and obtained license.

Unable to resist the pressure which he felt to be upon him, Brother Smith at once took work in the active ministry and for two years (1888-1889) served as Junior Preacher on Montgomery Circuit. When the Conference met at St. Paul's, Baltimore, in the spring of 1890, he was admitted on trial and appointed to Linganore Circuit. At the Conference of 1892, held in Harrisonburg, he was received into full connection and ordained Deacon by Bishop Keener; two years later, in Fredricksburg, he was ordained Elder by Bishop Granbery.

In addition to those already named, the following appointments were served during a ministry of almost twenty-seven years: Freedom, Potomac, Patuxent, Hillsboro, Md., Greenville, Laurel, Strasburg, Prince George and Brunswick, where he ceased both to work and to live.

Brother Smith was a master workman. On going to a charge he planned the campaign to be waged as a general would a battle, and then allowed nothing to turn him aside. He was an indefatigable pastor; no road was too rough, no storm too severe and no summer's heat too intense for him in carrying on his Master's work. Each interest of the Conference had his careful attention. He was loyal to every obligation laid upon him. Weary, though he often was, in body, his mind was every alert, and on his bed just a few hours before his death with his own hand he wrote the reports for an approaching Quarterly Conference and arranged for every business to be transacted. He loved the Gospel that he preached, and, with a firm grasp upon the fundamentals of faith, and a rich experience of divine grace, he loved to preach that Gospel as the power of God unto the salvation of men.

Never very strong, Brother Smith was for years a sufferer from indigestion, which at times became acute. Warned by several attacks in recent years, he felt that the end could not be very far away, and kept his house in order. While apparently recovering from a severe visitation of the old trouble, a sudden recurrence took place and instantly the conversation he was carrying on with his devoted wife was broken asunder, as his tired heart ceased to beat and his spirit took its everlasting flight. The end came on October 20, 1917, in the midst of a splendid and successful pastorate.

Brother Smith was married February 22, 1893, to Miss Lorena Day, who, with one son, Lee Burgess Smith, survives him.

The funeral was held in the church at Brunswick, conducted by the Rev. H. M. Canter, Presiding Elder of the Washington District, assisted by the Rev. F. M. Richardson and several ministers of other denominations. A congregation which overflowed the auditorium testified to the tender love which the people had for their pastor and the large place he had won for himself in the esteem of the community.

The interment was at Glenelg, Maryland. There, in the shadow of the church where he often preached, his body was laid to rest and waits "the dawning of that day Whose coming maketh all things new."

### EPHRAIM LEE KREGELO.

The subject of this memoir was born near Taneytown, Carroll County, Maryland, July 22, 1829. He passed to rest from Shepherdstown, West Virginia, on November 17, 1917, in the eighty-ninth year of his age.

He was converted and joined the Methodist Church in early life. He entered the active ministry in Washington County, Maryland, in April, 1852, at the age of twenty-three. His first charge was Boonsboro, which embraced Sharpsburg and an adjacent appointment. A year later he was admitted to the Baltimore Conference in a class including, among others, the late Bishop Alpheus W. Wilson. At the time of his death he was the oldest member of the Conference and the last surviving one of his class—his ministry having covered an unbroken period of sixty-five years.

Brother Kregelo's first appointment in the Baltimore Conference was Covington and Warm Springs Circuit as Junior Preacher. This was in 1853. The years following the outbreak of the Civil War he served successfully Lexington, McClintonville, Emitsburg, Luray and Colliertown. In April, 1861, he was transferred to the Tennessee Conference and was appointed for one year each to churches in Maury County, Tennessee, and Athens, Alabama. He was then transferred back to his own Conference and was appointed in 1864 to Shepherdstown, where he served for three years. His next charge was Hillsboro and his last Winchester. In 1870 a serious throat trouble forced him to retire from the active service. For several years he sustained a supernumerary relation to the Conference, and despite his feeble health continued to do effective work in supplying pulpits and assisting in revival meetings. For several years prior to his death he had been granted a superannuated relation.

Brother Kregelo was a man of polish and culture, having received his education at Gettysburg College in Pennsylvania. He was a wide reader and a close student and his preaching was of a high order.

In May, 1855, he married Miss Martha W. Hull, of Rockbridge County, Virginia. After more than thirty years of happy married life she

preceded him to the better world. In 1906 he was married to Mrs. Katharine McQuilkin, of Shepherdstown, W. Va., a woman known throughout the Conference for her loyal Methodism and who was untiring in her devotion during his last illness.

Brother Kregelo's character never had a question mark against it. From boyhood to the time of his death his life was hid with Christ in God. None who knew him ever had to question his stand on any moral issue. He prayed much in secret and was wonderfully gifted in public prayer. A great student of the Bible, he was never troubled by doubts as to its teachings. They were to him verities as immutable as the very throne of God.

Inclined by nature to be of a grave, retiring disposition, it at times gave an unjust impression of austerity, but to those who knew him well he revealed a heart as warm and sympathetic as ever beat in human breast. His friendships once formed were strong and lasting. Wherever he lived he was known as a friend to the poor, and even in his last days he sought the bedside of the sick and dying to administer spiritual comfort.

He was a devoted father and to him was given in return, by his son and daughter, still living, a reverent love, which was a further testimony to the father's noble life.

He died in the peace and calm of those who knew in Whom they have believed. His funeral service was conducted by Rev. H. P. Hamill, D. D., assisted by the writer of this memoir. His body was laid to rest by the side of the wife of his youth in Lexington, Va., and of none who rest in that same ground can it be more truly said: "I have fought a good fight, I have kept the faith, henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, shall give me in that day."

**MEMORIALS TO THE GENERAL CONFERENCE.**

## (I)

WHEREAS, The time limit in our Church is now fixed at four years, and whereas conditions sometimes arise when this limit should be extended, therefore,

*Resolved*, That the approaching General Conference be memorialized to so modify the law that, without removing this time limit in its general application, a preacher may be appointed to the same work for as many as six successive years when in the judgment of the presiding Bishop and two-thirds of the Presiding Elders it should be done.

## (II)

*Resolved*, That the Baltimore Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, memorialize the General Conference to so amend Paragraph 103, Section II, Chapter III, of our Book of Discipline as to remove the "time limit" and give to our Chief Pastors the power of unrestricted appointment as to time, according to their godly judgment.

## (III)

That Paragraph 754 relating to the baptism of children be so changed that instead of reading: "That you may ever remain in the number of God's faithful and elect children," it will read: "That you may ever remain in the number of God's dedicated and accepted children through Jesus Christ our Lord."

## (IV)

*Resolved*, That the Baltimore Conference Methodist Episcopal Church, South, does hereby memorialize the General Conference to so amend the Discipline that all stewards be elected by the Church Conference on nomination of the Preacher in Charge provided no member under eighteen years of age be allowed to vote.

## (V)

*Resolved*, That the General Conference create Episcopal Districts and that the appointments to the several Districts be made by the Committee on Episcopacy at the beginning of the quadrennium, subject to such changes during the quadrennium as circumstances and wisdom may demand.

## (VI)

WHEREAS, We learn that the Western Virginia Conference has taken action with the view of having the General Conference transfer that part of the Lewisburg District lying within the State of West Virginia, to the Western Virginia Conference, *Therefore, be it*

*Resolved*, That we most earnestly and respectfully memorialize the General Conference to make no change in the boundary line affecting the relation of the Lewisburg District to the Baltimore Conference.

## (VII)

*Resolved*, That in Par. 388 of the Discipline, lines 6-10, beginning with "according to" and ending with "Claimants", be stricken out and the following substituted in its place: "As follows: Each superannuate shall receive an annuity of a definite sum, to be determined by each annual Conference, the minimum being ten dollars, multiplied by the number of years of active service he has given the Church, and each widow, half this amount multiplied by the number of years she has been the wife of a preacher in active service, which amount in each case shall be further supplemented by such an additional sum as shall, in the judgment of the Board, be required to meet the necessities of the claimants." So that the paragraph thus amended shall read as follows, beginning line 3:

"and distribute the same to the superannuated preachers and the widows and orphans of deceased members of the Conference as follows: Each superannuate shall receive an annuity of a definite sum to be determined by each Annual Conference, the minimum being ten dollars multiplied by the number of years of active service he has given the Church and each widow half this amount multiplied by the number of years she has been the wife of a preacher in active service; which amount in each case shall be further supplemented by such an additional sum as shall in the judgment of the Board be required to meet the necessities of the claimant; provided further that when a preacher breaks down in the work," etc.

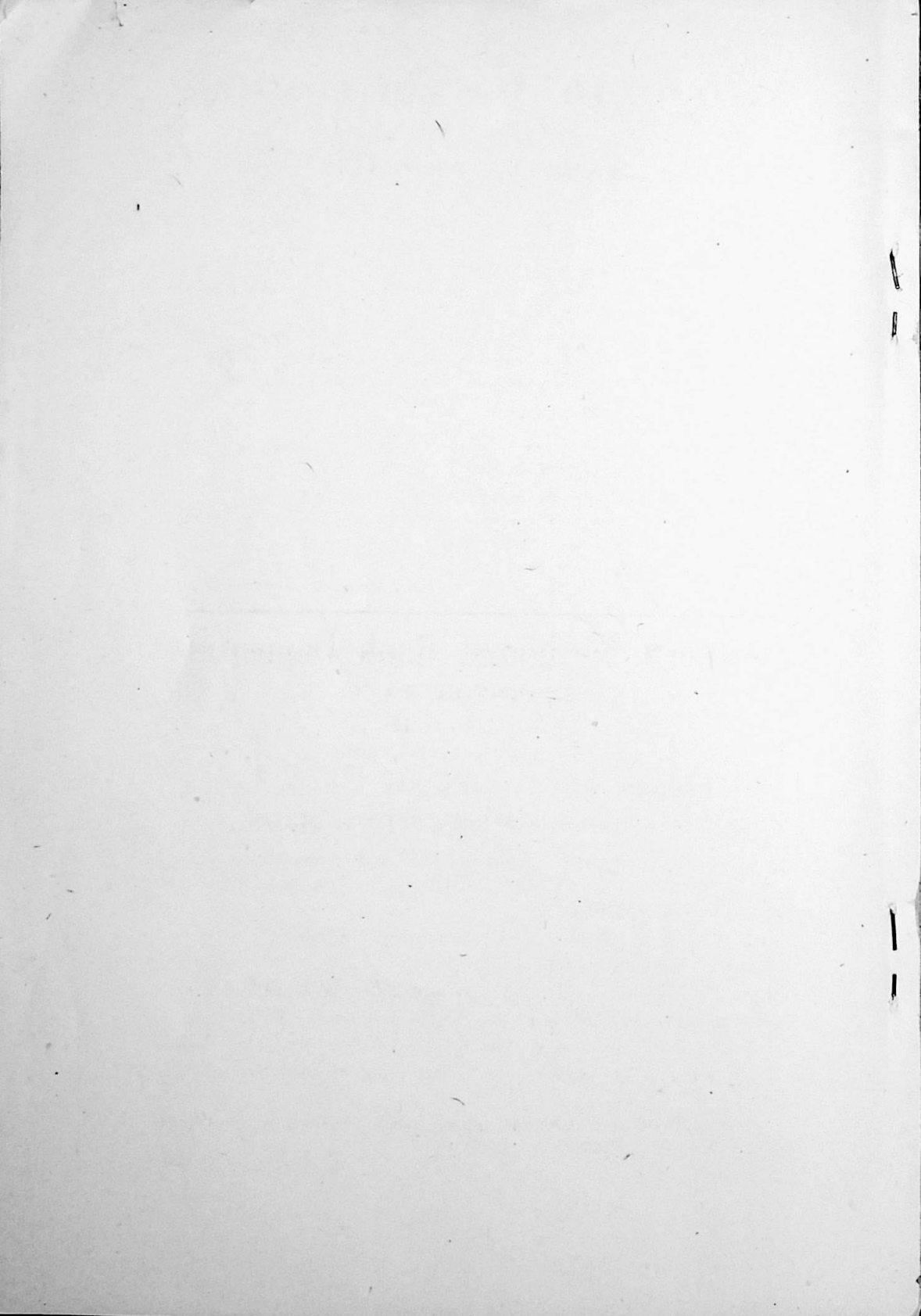
