





- Letters of inquiry concerning details of each year's work should be addressed to the first named Examiner.
- 3. Examiners of the several classes are requested to arrange the work according to their preferences and to comply with the Disciplinary instructions. See Appendix, paragraph 65, sections 3 and 7.

Rules of Order.

Rule I. The President shall decide all questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Conference; but in case of such appeal, the question shall be taken without debate.

Rule II. He shall appoint all committees not otherwise specially ordered by the Conference.

Rule III. On assigning the floor to any member of Conference, he shall distinctly announce the name of the member to whom he assigns it.

Rule IV. All motions or resolutions introduced by any member shall be presented in writing, if the President, Secretary, or any two members request it.

Rule V. When a motion or resolution is move and seconded, or a report is presented, and is read by the Secretary, or stated by the President, it shall be deemed in possession of the Conference; but any motion or resolution may be withdrawn by the mover, with the consent of Conference, at any time before amendment or decision.

Rule VI. The motion to adjourn, to lay on the table, to take from the table, or for the previous question, shall be taken without debate.

Rule VII. No new motion or resolution shall be entertained until the one under consideration has been disposed of, which may be done by adoption or rejection, unless one of the following motions shall intervene, which shall have precedence in the order in which they are here placed, namely:
(1) To fix the time to which the Conference shall adjourn. (2) To adjourn. (3) To lay on the table. (4) For the previous question. (5) To postpone to a given time. (6) To refer to a committee. (7) Substitute. (8) Amendment. (9) To postpone indefinitely.

Rule VIII. A substitute or amendment may be amended.

Rule IX. When any member is about to speak in debate, or to deliver any matter to the Conference, he shall rise and respectfully address the President.

Rule X. No member shall be interrupted when speaking, except by the President to call him to order when he departs from the question, or uses personalities or disrespectful language; but any member may call the attention of the President to the subject when he deems a speaker out of order, and any member may explain if he thinks himself misrepresented.

Rule XI. No person shall speak more than twice on the same question, nor more than fifteen minutes at one time, without leave of the Conference; nor shall any person speak more than once until every member choosing to speak shall have spoken.

Rule XII. When any motion or resolution shall have been acted upon by the Conference it shall be in order for any member who voted with the prevailing side to move a reconsideration; but a motion to reconsider a non-debatable motion shall be decided without debate.

Rule XIII. No member shall absent himself from the service of the Conference without leave, unless he is sick or unable to attend.

Rule XIV. No member shall be allowed to vote on any question who is not within the bar at the time when such question is put by the President, except by leave of the Conference, when such member has been necessarily absent.

Rule XV. Every member who is within the bar at the time the question is put shall give his vote, unless the Conference, for special reasons excuse him.

Rule XVI. It shall be in order for any member to call for the yeas and nays in any question before the Conference; and, if the call be sustained by twenty-five members present, the vote thereon shall be taken by yeas and nays.

Rule XVII. It shall be in order to move that the question shall be taken without further debate, on any measure pending before the Conference, except in cases where character or Conference relations are involved; and, if sustained by a two-thirds vote, the question shall be so taken; nevertheless, it shall be in order under this rule to move to recommit, to divide, or to lay on the table after the previous question has been ordered.

Rule XVIII. The motion to adjourn shall be taken without debate, and shall always be in order, except (1) when a member has the floor; (2) when a question is actually put, or vote is being taken; (3) when a question is pending on sustaining the demand for the previous question; (4) when the previous question has been called and sustained, and action under it is still pending; (5) when a motion to adjourn has been negatived, and no business or debate has intervened; and (6) when a motion to fix the time to which the Conference shall adjourn is pending or shall be made.

Pasto 1 Record—On motion of J. H. Nutter, each member was requested to send to the Secretary his record of time and work in the Conference, dating from the time of being received into full membership.

Resolution—W. C. Dickerson read a resolution of thanks to the Bishop. The resolution was adopted by a rising vote.

Committee on Resolutions—W. E. Waters read the resolutions of Thanks. They were adopted. See resolutions.

Resolution to N. W. Moore—A resolution of appreciation was offered in commendation of the work of N. W. Moore.

Adjournment—On motion of F. H. Butler, the Conference was ordered to stand adjourned without date after the reading of the Appointments by the Bishop.

The Minutes Approved.—The Minutes of the Morning and Afternoon sessions were approved.

Announcements—Announcements were made, and final address by the Presiding Bishop.

After reading the Appointments, the Doxology was sung, and the Benediction was pronounced by the Bishop.

District Superintendents' Reports.

CAMBRIDGE DISTRICT.

BISHOP AND BRETHREN:-

Notwithstanding the gathering storm on the political horizon incident to a presidential year; notwithstanding the unrest among our great financiers and the halt of the wheels of industry and its accompanying moneypanic among laborers; notwithstanding the failure in some of our most profitable agricultural crops-abundant have been the blessings of God which we have received during the year. With but one or two exceptions no Charge has suffered seriously in a financial way; no congregation has been torn asunder by the wolf of strife; none of our pastors have died. none have suffered a prolonged illness. On the other hand nature has been beneficent. While our crops were not as large as those of the preceding year, yet, not a single person, to our knowledge, has been compelled to go hungry or in want of raiment because there were not enough to feed and clothe every needy soul. I believe the spirit of Christian Brotherhood posesses us more largely than ever; our vision of the needs of the people to whom we must minister is more extensive and more piercing; under the glare of the advancing Sun of Righteousness our brethren are preaching Jesus as never before.

Our hearts were saddened by the death of two beloved sisters during the year. Though at the time of her death she was not in the active work, it would seem like ingratitude and cold heartedness not to mention the death of Mrs. Sarah Earle, the beloved wife of the Rev. Charles Earle, who served well in this Conference as a supply for 22 years. She was optimistic and warm hearted in spirit. There are a number of men on this Conference floor today who owe much to her cheerfulness and devotion to the cause of Christ. A suitable memoir will be published.

The beloved wife of the Rev. L. H. Martin of Vienna died suddenly in February. They had not been married a year, yet she had so completely become his companion in the struggles incident to the ministerial life, such an inspiration to the people whom they served, his loss is keen. A suitable memoir will be presented.

A Survey of the Field.

AIREYS is still advancing. Not so much in finance as in the spiritual. There is a marked spiritual fervor pervading the whole Charge. Conversions, 10: probationers, 8; accessions, 4; benevolences slightly in advance of last year. Raised \$125 for improvements.—G. T. Townsend, pastor.

BECKWITH seems to have received a new supply of activity and comes up with a fine achievement for the year. Zoar Church has been painted inside and out, a new suit of pulpit furniture put in. A much more desirable place for a parsonage than the old site has been purchased and is now occupied by the pastor. Raised for improvements, \$203; and more than \$850 for all purposes; benevolences not quite up to last year; conversions, 24; probationers, 18; accessions, 6. Supplied by J. H. Grinnage.

BRIDGEVILLE has had the most prosperous year in its history. The Church in Bridgeville proper has been in a dilapidated condition for some time and did not represent its progressive constituents. Early in the year the pastor and people determined to have a representative Church building. A very substantial two-story building replaces the old dilapidated one-story house. The greatest economy was used. So much as was possible of the old Church was used in the new building. The lower room is completed and used for worship. It is a very beautiful room. The contract on this new building was \$1,500, and it is said that the contractor lost about \$300. The amount raised and paid on the new church this year, is \$562; the total amount raised at this Church alone for all purposes is \$1150; total for the charge, \$1365. Conversions, 12; probationers, 4; accessions, 8; benevolences up to last year.

Bridgeville ought to be a station. In order that the work should develope as it ought, the pastor must give his attention to the Sunday School and otherwise to the Church in town. With Trinity attached to the work, as it now is, both Churches suffer for the right kind of pastoral supervision. Mt. Calvary, as the new Church is now called, is fully able to give a liberal support to a pastor if there were the right kind of service given. This is no reflection upon the pastor whatever, it is simply a case where his service is needed at the one point. Trinity will never be developed till she has better pastoral oversight in the Sunday School and otherwise. Some of the leaders seem unable to see the advantage in the division fearing a little increase in expenses. J. W. Fenderson, pastor.

CAMBRIDGE STATION has had a rather unfortunate year. No Charge in the District has felt the financial depression so seriously as it has been felt here. Cambridge is not a manufacturing town, the principal industry being the oyster trade. The warm weather and the small demand for oysters in the North contributed to make this the dullest season in the oyster trade in this city for many years past. Furthermore the largest number of out-of-town shuckers came to Cambridge this year in search of work that has come for a long time. Work was scarce and the laborers many. The effect of this condition upon the home people must be apparent to all. Nevertheless a splendid year's work has been done. A steam heater at a cost of \$675 has been put in. The pastor reports \$265 paid on improvements; paid on old debts, \$1400, and nearly \$3,000 raised for all purposes; benevolences taken. Conversions, 9; probationers, 10; accessions, 17; and one class formed for religious instruction.

The pastor is closing his eleventh year's work in this Charge. The beautiful parsonage in which the Bishop's cabinet meets marks the first of his achievements; this artistic edifice in which we are now assembled, the progress of which has been reported yearly during the six years of its building, is a monument to his leadership and untiring efforts. These two buildings hold a silent language more eloquent than any audible word. They invite the eye of every beholder. Pease and harmony among pastor and people still prevail. A. L. Martin, pastor.

CAMBRIDGE CIRCUIT has a very good year under the leadership of brother Davis. The congregation at Dickerson is about doubled. The Church has been thoroughly renovated at a cost of \$41 and paid.

Asbury Church, better known as the Mission on Pine Street extended, this City, has been renovated at a cost of \$23. The trustees have started a Savings Fund for a new Church building.

At Christ Rock a new organ and new suit of pulpit furniture and a number of old debts paid. Raised for improvements, \$118; on old debts, \$52; benevolences, 33 per cent. over last year. Conversions, 18; probationers, 30. C. E. Davis, pastor.

CHURCH CREEK has done the unexpected and comes up with the best report in the last four years. Paid for improvements, \$25; on old debts, \$66; benevolences, 54 per cent. above last year. Conversions, 17; probationers, 17; accessions, 65. Jose Angulo, pastor.

CRAPO is not so successful as last year, yet all the failure is at one Church, John Wesley, at Liners' Roads. This Church is factional and has been for years. It neither paid the pastor nor raised the benevolences. The other three churches are full in everything. Paid on old debts, \$60. Conversions, 30; probationers, 50; accessions, 20. 1. D. Paine, pastor.

EAST NEW MARKET raised about \$270 for trustees and paid pastor in full. Something has been done for the benevolences. Conversions, 4; accessions, 5. Brother Horsey is closing his thirty-first year in the active work of the ministry. He has served well, but his physical condition now forces him to ask, at his own request, to be superannuated. Our prayers and sympathy and help are his.

FEDERALSBURG has made great progress in Christian unity during the past two years. The old factional spirit seems to have died a timely death. Raised for improvements, \$39; on old debts, \$85; benevolences full and 30 per cent. in advance of last year. Conversions, 3; probationers, 22; accessions, 21; one class of children formed for religious instruction. C. W. Moore, pastor.

FRANKFORD still holds her own. Raised for old debts, \$60; benevolences, same as last year. Conversions, 16; probationers, 15; accessions, 8. C. W. Downs, pastor.

HARRINGTON actually leads the District in the increase of benevolent collections. The pastor has labored hard and obtained results. The actual increase in benevolences over last year is just 100 per cent. This is remarkable. Raised for improvements, \$52; on old debts, \$23. Conversions, 14; probationers, 14; accessions, 6.

A fine property near the Church has been purchased at a cost of \$550. This price is said to be far below the actual value of the property, but the owner desires to help the Church. The pastor will occupy the property upon the adjournment of this Conference. G. R. Hollis, pastor.

HURLOCK has passed all previous records. The salary was raised from \$450 to \$500 this year and every dollar has been paid. Raised for improvements, \$191; on old debts, \$91; benevolences about the same as last year. Conversions, 18; probationers, 18; accessions, 3; class of children formed for religious instruction, 3. J. W. Bowling, pastor.

LAUREL is one of the strongest of our small stations. A great year's work has been done at this point. The main audience room has been thorcughly renovated and beautified. It will compare favorably with St. Paul, Milford, and New Bethel, Berlin. The cost of the improvement was \$118 and was raised at one collection. Paid on old debts, \$108; benevolences full and nearly 10 per cent. in advance of last year; raised for the Carnegie Endowment Fund, \$60. Conversions, 41; probationers, 35; accessions, 13. R. H. Wallace, pastor.

LEWES has had another year of splendid success. Every benevolent apportionment is full and 20 per cent. in advance of last year. Raised for improvements, \$71.16; for old debts, \$81.28. Conversions, 2; probationers, 3. J. W. Cook, pastor.

LINCOLN is at the front. I am not aware of any congregation within the bounds of this Conference that has built a new church and paid for it in so short a time as the congregation at Slaughter Neck has done. The Church was built two years ago at a cost of \$2800. The Board fo Home Missions and Church Extension donated \$200. There is not a dollar against the Church. The trustees assumed a small amount that can be paid at almost any time with proper management. Raised for improvements, \$21; for old debts, \$443.08; benevolences full and in advance of last year. Conversions, 72; probationers, 48; accessions, 12. 2 classes of children formed for religious instruction. F. C. Wright, pastor.

LINKWOOD has done well. Raised for improvements, \$52; for old debts, \$30. Conversions, 25; probationers, 17; accessions, 3; benevolences, 28 per cent. In advance of last year. The Church at Thompsontown is entirely too small for the growing congregation and is not properly located. The trustees have purchased a six-acre lot for a new Church and cemetery in a better location. They also have in Bank \$132 on the new Church. They will build in the near future. Although this Church has been known as the Mission Church from the time that it was built, it is the strongest Church on the Charge. G. T. Fields, pastor.

MADISON is holding the same grade that she made last year. Raised for improvements, \$90; for old debts, \$110; benevolences, nearly full. Conversions, 35; probationers, 35; accessions, 10. From my own observation I have the conviction that there is no Charge in the District where

the pastor and his wife are doing more for the moral and social elevation of the people than is done in this Charge. W. C. West, pastor.

MARDELLA SPRINGS is a very strong Charge and a very fine year's work has been done. A gracious revival has been going on in this Charge almost all the year, resulting in 145 conversions; 75 probationers; 70 accessions. Raised for building and improvements, \$475; paid on new church, \$288.07; benevolences full.

This is another instance where the work has outgrown itself. The Church at Sharptown is strong enough for a station and has already asked to be set apart next year. There are a great many young people at this point and a pastor will find a good field of labor. J. W. Gillis, pastor.

MILFORD has made marked improvement along some lines. The congregation is larger than it has been for some time past. The spiritual life seems greatly quickened. A gracious revival swept over the town resulting in 43 conversions; probationers, 15. Paid on the mortgage, \$222.91; on old debts, \$229.20; benevolences in advance of last year. J. H. B. Hubbard, pastor.

NASSAU AND REHOBOTH claim to be mentioned among our most successful Charges. The pastor has led his people along the highways of moral and spiritual improvement. The congregation at Wesley has needed a new church building for a good many years. This need has been partially met this Conference year. A beautiful building of cement block has been erected at Belltown at cost of \$2000. It has been completed so that the congregation has worshipped in it this winter. When completed, it will be one of the most substantial Churches in our District. Paid on new Church, \$400; on improvements otherwise, \$123; benevolences raised in part. Conversions, 60; probationers, 45; accessions, 15. D. W. Martin, pastor.

NORTH BERLIN now consists of two churches, St. Paul and St. John. St. John was detached from the South Berlin Charge and added this year. Under the leadership of the present pastor, St. John has received an inspiration which is well nigh phenominal. A revival has been going on almost all the year. The Church has been thoroughly renovated at a cost of \$160, every cent of which was raised in one collection.

St. Paul is not the largest, but in many respects the leading Church in the district. This Church can actually get ready for Conference during the first quarter of the Conference year. This is the one Church where no collection is necessary on Quarterly Meeting occasions. The District Superintendent has had an opportunity to help the people along moral and spiritual lines. Conversions, 48; probationers, 23; accessions, 24; one class of children formed for religious instruction. Raised for improvements, \$202; benevolences full and in advance of last year. J. F. Molock, pastor.

PRESTON still holds her own. There are no debts on this Charge and there is no chance for a great financial report. The pastor has been directing his efforts along moral and spiritual lines. In order to appreciate the work done in this appointment one must know the past and he must know the present. It is the most needed work in all our Charges. Conversions, 9; probationers, 5; accessions, 8; one class of children formed for religious instruction. Paid for improvements, \$36; benevolences full. J. W. Jewett, pastor.

SEAFORD sends up a good report, but the work is entirely too large and ought to be divided. The pastor cannot give the oversight to the young people which is so necessary to their moral and religious development. It is almost impossible for him to give any attention to the Sunday School and other young people's societies. Trinity from the Bridgeville Circuit ought to be united with Bethel of the Seaford Circuit and form a new Charge where the pastor could give the right kind of oversight to these important congregations. These people will never be developed till this or some similar division is made. There are just a few obstacles in the way that perhaps make it unwise to do so at this juncture. Paid for improvements, \$120; on parsonage, \$170; on Bethel Church, \$135; benevolences partially raised; raised on the Carnegie Endowment Fund, \$31. Conversions, 33; probationers, 12; accessions, 8; classes of children formed for religious instruction, 4. T. W. Cooper, pastor.

SOUTH BERLIN Charge has had remarkable success along all lines. Cedar Chapel has been repaired and renovated at a cost of \$125. This Church has been in an unsightly condition for some time. The people and pastor deserve great credit for its now neat and attractive appearance. New Bethel has been most successful in her finance. The pastor reports \$125 paid on improvements; on New Bethel Church, \$741; and total amount on old debts, \$802; benevolences full and in advance of last year. Conversions, 65; probationers, 51; accessions, 10; one class of children formed for religious instruction. Raised for the Carengie Endowment Fund, \$22. G. W. Downs, pastor.

TRINITY has had a very successful year when all the circumstances are considered. Raised for old debts, \$146; benevolences nearly equal to last year. Pastor paid in full. Conversions, 16; probationers, 16; accessions, 2; one class of children formed for religious instruction. T. A. Johnson, pastor.

VIENNA is recovering normal conditions. Although nothing has been done towards completing Wesley Church, a goodly number of small and annoying bill have been paid; the people seem greatly ensouraged under the leadership of brother Martin and seem determined to resume work on the Church in the near future and complete it. Paid on old debts, \$191; benevolences full and 28 per cent. in advance of last year. Conversions, 41; probationers, 38; accessions, 1. L. H. Martin, pastor.

WHALEYVILLE has not done so well as in former years. Paid on improvements, \$40; on parsonage, \$106.50; benevolences far below last year. Conversions, 12; probationers, 25; accessions, 12. Supplied by B. F. Lowber.

The Ladies Aid Societies.

The Ladies' Aid Society is the strongest auxiliary that we have. We feel that these earnest workers should have recognition in our report for the great work which they are doing and so we give the report from each Charge in the number of members and the amount of money raised by each. Mt. Calvary, Bridgeville, 40 members, \$120; Cambridge Circuit, Christ Rock, 42 members, \$42.61; Federalsburg, Zion, 29 members, \$116; Frankford, 56 members, \$163; Lincoln, Wesley, 46 members, \$132.50; Mt. Zion, 42 members, \$38.50; Linkwood, 20 members, \$30; Madison, 40 members, \$25; Nassau: Wesley, 48 members, \$25; Mt. Pleasant, 36 members, \$14; Preston, Mt. Pleasant, 38 members, \$52; Seaford, John Wesley, 10 members, \$42; South Berlin, 109 members, \$220.

Education.

There is much interest shown in our educational institutions. Our people realize more and more the value of education as a means to a better life. Ideals are sought and an exemplification of ideals in practical life. Never have our young people required so much from the Christian Minister as today. As an institution of religious instruction the needs of our Sunday Schools were never so demanding. Where the Epworth Leagues can be kept in working shape they are doing much towards increasing refinement among our young people.

There is much interest shown in the Carnegie proposition to donate Morgan College \$50,000. Our effort has been to raise the full apportionment of \$2,100 to this district, but in this we have failed. We have succeeded, however, in securing in reliable subscriptions more than \$1,300, and not more than one half of our people have been reached. We have succeeded in raising but about \$250 this year. Our hope is to raise all during the first months of the next year. The following is a partial list of what has been done: Mrs. Emma Deputy, St. Paul, Milford, contributed \$8; Church Creek, \$4; Preston, \$12; Federalsburg, \$30; Seaford, \$31; South Berlin, \$22; North Berlin, \$66; Laurel, \$60; Cambridge Circuit, \$12.75; and there a few others who did not report to me.

The district is still progressing along financial lines and reports for Foreign Missions, \$564, an increase over last year; for Home Missions and Church Extension, \$384, an increase over last year, total for Foreign and Home Missions, \$948; for Freedmen's Aid, \$421; for Conference Claimants, \$351. Total raised by the district including the Episcopal Fund and the Carnegie Fund, as reported by pastors, \$2690. This is more than ever before.

The revival fires have been burning upon our altars almost the whole year, resulting in 837 conversions, 643 probationers, and 413 accessions. All the glory belongs to God and we are thankful that He has called us to be laborers together with Him.

CENTREVILLE DICTRICT.

BISHOP AND BRETHREN:-

This is my sixth and last Annual Report of the work of the Centreville District. This has been a good and busy year. Every hour has been crowded full of something to do in the line of our work. And we have been busy too. There has not been a moment's doubt and discouragement. The field everywhere has been full of the promise of an abundant harvest. We leave the soil teeming, rich and fertile; waiting for the sower and the seed.

The Lord has been with us. He has been our guide and stay; to Him belongs the glory.

Many things have devolved upon us. The work is getting large and there is more to be done each year. The brethren have worked faithfully to make the work succeed. Nearly every Charge has made advances along most all lines of church work; and yet there is plenty of room for further advancement. Some of our best work are longshore charges, and the people depend upon the oyster industry for a livelihood. This has been the dullest year in the oyster business during my administration. Plenty of oysters, but little market, and prices very low, sometimes selling as low as 14 cents per bushel. This states of things has greatly hindered the financial success.

The lives of the brethren have been spared. Some sickness and the death of one infant are the only gloomy things that have for a time, cast a veil over the homes. Brother and sister J. T. Fletcher were saddened by the death of their only child, the baby boy, Cranston. Brother J. H. Harmon was called away from his home on important business, returned after two days to find his family quarantined, his grand child being sick with diptheria. For several days brother Harmon was not permitted to enter his home. Fortunately all of the other members of his family escaped the disease. Brother R. G. Riley was quite sick in the early part of the year; we were very apprehensive of him, but he has fully recovered and has done one of the best year's work of his life. Much of the time his family were sick. Among others who have been seriously sick and ought to be mentiontioned are: Mrs. J. W. Bond, Mrs. Mattie Johnson, and Mrs. I. D. Pitts. But the brethren count these: "Light afflictions and but for a moment"; hence they have trusted God and gone forward without complaining.

Education.

Our interest in education is not waneing. Though we have not done by far what we ought to have done nor what we can do. The Charges report for this cause, for Princess Anne Academy, Needy Students and Children's Fund, \$70. Our effort to meet the offer of Mr. Carnegie has not been what we hoped; yet something has been done. All things considered the brethren have done well, but we must do better. The fate of Morgan College, I believe, hangs with the success or failure of this effort. If we will neet this and secure the \$100,000, Morgan College will be financially secured for all time; but if we fail, the permanency of Morgan College will

be uncertain. We can move the probability of its uncertainty and fix the fact of its permanency. Let us do it.

It should not be necessary for a golden tongued orator, or a bewitching story teller to convince us of our duty in this matter and to inspire us to action. The educational needs of our people, the dense ignorance and superstition we meet daily, the poor public school facilities and the indifference, in some instances, on the part of our people to send their children to the public schools ought to stir us to the depth of our being and, appeal not only to our liberal response to this duty, but to our selfdenial and itching sacrifice to meet this offer. It is to our benefit and to the benefit of our children. We can raise the money, we should raise it, let us do it.

The efforts to raise this money should not lesson our interest along other educational lines. Every legitimate movement for the intellectual development of our young people ought to have our hearty support. Every home where there are children ought to be a private school house receiving and importing instruction in the fundamentals of life. We must educate, inform, instruct, and import knowledge till our people everywhere are convinced that their greatest need is "knowledge" and for the "lack of it they are perishing."

Spiritual Conditions.

There has not been great revivals on the District this year as in some other years, yet the revival spirit has run high in some places, and many have been brought into the kingdom. The pastors report 586 converts and 498 accessions.

Our people attend church well; not only the preaching services, but the class and prayer meetings. Of a class enrollment of 4251, the class leaders report an average attendance for this year of 2185; and of 1394 heads of families, 1219 observe family worship. The Sunday Schools have had revivals and several children have been added to the church.

The Epworth League work is in good condition. The Conventions were largely attended and the interest was enthusiastic.

The Epworth League is doing effective service among the young people. It promises to be a mighty educational and spiritual force among us. The progress is necessarily slow but by continued faithful work it will be sure. The work among the young people is very promising. We should continue to push vigorously our work along this line.— 22 classes of children for religious instruction are reported.

Temperance.

In spite of the argument to the effect that there is as much drunkedness in what is known as "dry" places as where it is "wet," we find the conditions are not one-third as bad as where there were open saloons. The low and sneaking speakeasy business goes on and in some places in a large way and by people who take an attitude to the business like the monkey to the cat and the chestnuts in the hot embers; they get the spoils but escape the fire. The jails in Chestertown, Centreville and Easton were overtaxed last fall around election time with our poor ignorant people. The cause for their being there, in most cases, might have been traced to the

speakeasy business. A diligent search might have revealed that they were tools in the hands of a wiser man who holds the money purse and the ballot. The effect is hurtful to the best interests of all the people. But our best people are against the speakeasy and stand for total abstinence. There is a strong sentiment in the churches in favor of temperance. Several of the Quarterly Conferences passed strong resolutions in support of the local option and state-wide prohibition. All our territory is dry and we have done what we could to keep it dry.

Support.

We have endeavored to induce the people to give to the pastors comfortable support. The most of the Charges have advanced the salary. The District paid this year an average salary of \$536.

The new Conference Claimant's scheme has been before the people and they are taking kindly to it. Some of the Charges have raised something for the Special Fund.

Charges.

CARMICHAELS.—A revival wave swept through what is known as Wye Neck neighborhood that greatly quickened the church and revived the spiritual life of the people; 33 persons were converted. This Charge has done well financially. Raised for old debt, \$450; and for repairs, \$150. \$84 of the benevolent apportionment was raised, an increase over last year. Carnegie Fund, \$11.

CENTREVILLE STATION reports the benevolences raised in full and \$18 for the Carnegie Fund. The pastor and people have been planning for a new church, and the way is now well open. They have in bank for the new building about \$200. The work has been faithfully looked after. The spiritual condition was never better. The Epworth League is doing a splendid work, especially the Junior League. The Women's Home Missionary Society, with the pastor's wife as the president, is a mighty morsionary Society the cause of temperance is fostered and the young women and men are helped.

CENTREVILLE CIRCUIT.—The pastor has worked hard to make this work succeed and though some of the people were not as active with him as they might have been, he has made the work succeed. Raised on old debt, \$132; and for repairs, \$202; the benevolences advanced 100 per cent. over last year.

CHESTERTOWN is still on the upward grade. This has been a prosperous year with the people of this station. They seem to think that there is something for every one to do and that every one should do his share of the work; hence, they have thoroughly organized the church and every body has been faithful to the trust that was given him. The debt was diminished \$225, and \$62 raised for repairs. The benevolences raised and \$57 on the Carnegie Fund. Conversions 30, and 38 accessions.

CHURCH HILL.—This Charge had a great revival, 72 persons professed saving faith in the Lord Jesus and were added to the church. \$260 have been raised for debt and repairs and the benevolent collections doubled. The Sunday Schools and the Epworth Leagues have been revived and are doing good work. Two of the brightest young men of the place are attending school at Princess Anne Academy.

COLEMAN STATION brings up an excellent report. The work is in a healthy condition. Good Epworth Leagues and a live Sunday School. This Charge has no debt. The parsonage ought to be rebuilt and made larger. The people are fully able to do it. Coleman is one of the strongest points on the District. A large membership and congregation.

They have raised this year for debt and repairs \$130, the benevolences raised in full, including a collection for the Veteran's Fund of Conference Claimants, and \$20 for the Carnegle Fund.

CORDOVA.—This Charge has been spiritually alive all the year, 23 persons converted and 20 accessions. The Epworth Leagues are active and the young people generally looked after. A lot costing \$50 has been purchased and paid for. During next year they expect to build a church that will take the place of what is known as the "Mission." This done, Cordova may be divided into two circuits.

Raised for debt and repairs, \$160. The benevolences full and \$20 for the Carnegie Fund.

DENTON.—This Charge has advanced along all lines of the work. One church from the Ridgely Circuit was attached to Denton this year, making it a circuit of two churches and a mission. The work has moved on smoothly and very successfully. \$372 raised on the pursonage debt; \$137 for repairs. The benevolences raised in full and the full amount, which was \$60, for the Carnegie Fund. A gracious revival brought 74 souls into the Kingdom.

EASTON.—This is one of the leading appointments on the District. We have had a very good year at this point both spiritually and unancially. One of the best Junior Leagues is here; a large class of boys under ar active superintendent are studying the Scriptures systematically; and seem to delight in it. The work is in good condition. The Women's Home Missionary Society has been organized and is doing effective service among the women of the town. They report \$10.

Raised for debt and repairs, \$151. The benevolences raised in full, and \$10 for the Carnegie Fund.

EASTON DISTRICT.—This little work has nearly risen into selfsupport. It is gratifying to know what has been done here this year. The pastor took hold of this work with a determination to do something; and he has succeeded beyond our expectation. The church was repaired, the old debts paid, and the benevolent apportionment paid in full. They have a good congregation, a good Sunday School and a Choir that ranks with the best on the District.

FAIRLEE has had one of the most prosperous years in the history of the Circuit. The Sandy Bottom church was moved from the old site, which was muddy bottom, instead of "sandy bottom," out along the main road and in the settlement of the people. A tower and vestibule attached, some remodeling, the building renovated and painted, makes it one of our most beautiful churches. The whole cost was \$550, of which \$185 have been paid. The Charge raised for debt and repairs, \$553. The benevolences are in advance of last year. Carnegie Fund, \$16.

GREENSBORO closes another year with everything full and \$25 on the Carnegie Fund. Six years of faithful pastoral service have been spent in this Charge. The result is two new churches that cost \$3,000, every obligation satisfactorily met. The churches are spiritually alive; good Sunday Schools; flourishing Epworth League Chapters, and the moral tone lifted high. They have raised this year for the debt, \$377, this reduces the debt from \$3,000 to \$875. Conversions, 19; accessions, 24.

LONGWOODS was the first Charge to report in full for the Carnegie Fund. They also report the benevolences full. The church at Copperville was greatly quickened by a revival that resulted in 25 converts. Everything full and the salary advanced \$100.

McDANIEL began the work of building a new church that is to cost \$1200. All the lumber for the frame and the bricks are on the ground. This is a good little work and the present administration has made it much better. Nearly all the benevolent apportionment was raised, repairs kept up and the Charge left in good condition in every way.

MELITOTA reports \$100 raised on old debt, \$38 for repairs, the benevolences in advance of last year, 22 converts and 18 accessions.

OXFORD succeeded this year in building a church which they long needed. It is one of the handsomest of our churches on the Peninsula. Substantial and well built, and complete in every way. It is the best lighted church on the District. The architect is a Negro of Easton, Talbot County, Md. The pastor and the people are to be complimented. The whole cost is \$2650, of which sum, \$800, were raised this year. The benevolences were not neglected.

POMONA.—This big and influential circuit with a membership of over 260 souls and three churches, ought to be divided. While they do well, they would do much better if divided and two pastors sent among the people. They report for this year, \$60 raised for debt and repairs, and the benevolences. For the Carnegie Fund, \$10. The spiritual condition of the Charge is good. Conversions 30, and accessions, the same.

RIDGELY has done a fair year's work. \$200 raised for the debt and repairs and something on the benevolences. 15 conversions and accessions.

ROYAL OAK maintains her former record and advances some. This year they built a very much needed Hall at a cost of \$898 and paid \$200 on the same. Advanced the pastor's salary, raised for the debt, \$172, and for repairs, \$100. The benevolent collections taken in full.

ST. MICHAELS has had a very trying year. Besides the almost total failure in the oyster business, for over two months of the very best of the season for work the churches were closed and business at a standstill on the account of a disease epidemic; yet the report shows a good year's work with an advance along the financial lines. The benevolences raised in full. Amount raised on debt, \$160, and for repairs, \$338. Converts 33, accessions, 37.

STEVENSVILLE.—The dull oyster season had much to do with the success of this Charge. The oyster trade here, like St. Michaels, was a failure. But the pastor and the people worked hard and have done well. A revival that resulted in 57 converts, gave new life to the work. \$420 were raised for debt and repairs and the benevolences are in hand with \$4 for the Carnegie Fund.

STILL POND has every dollar of the benevolent money in full and \$12 for the Carnegie Fund. They built a hall or tabernacle for social gatherings and summer meetings. It cost \$311, and of this amount, \$136 have been paid. The churches are well organized and in a living spiritual condition.

Sister Johnson, the pastor's wife, is now at a hospital in Philadelphia for treatment. Her constant sickness has hindered her from carrying on her very effective service among the young people, where she is at home, and so efficient.

TRAPPE.—This Charge swung clear of debt this year. The mortgage against the church was paid off. They have purchased a fine site for a cemetery. The pastor has worked very hard against severe odds and the sheer indifference of some persons of influence; yet the work went on and up successfully and the Charge was never in better shape spiritually and financially. The records show that over \$100 have been raised each mouth during the present administration. The benevolences were raised.

The people are anxious for the return of the pastor.

WILLISTON has done well, all things considered. Raised for debt and repairs, \$---, and something on the benevolences.

The possibilities are good on the Williston Charge and the outlook is encouraging.

WITTMAN Charge has raised \$157 on old debt, and the benevolences in full. \$7 for the Carnegie Fund. A good work is being done here. The young people's meetings are well attended and very spiritual.

WOODLAND.—The pastor closes his fifth year with the people of Woodland Circuit, and the people everywhere, white and colored, want his return. The Charge is in splendid condition. The benevolences were raised, and for repairs, \$101.

Raised for Home Missions and Church Extension, \$603; Foreign Missions, \$651; raised on old debt, \$3,200; for repairs, \$2,115; and for all benevolent purposes, \$2,950; and for the Carnegie Fund, \$353.

All praise to the faithful pastors and their wives who have not only supported me in carrying forward the work, but have, in every instance, welcomed me into their homes and made me comfortable and happy and cheered me many times with their prayers and best wishes. And too, we have had the undivided support of the consecrated laymen. It has been through these that we have succeeded and today shout: "Victory:"

We humbly submit our report to your wise consideration and trustfully give place to him who is to follow.

Come on; my brother and friend, whoever you may be. The steed is groomed and harnessed; the reins are on the dashboard; there is no whip in the socket, for you will need no whip. Confidence in God, a sincere, well defined purpose with instructive and encouraging words are a sufficient goad to spur him on to victory, that will not only enhance the Redeemer's Kingdom and exalt our Christ, but will bring glory to you. Amen.

PRILADELPHIA DISTRICT.

ATLANTIC CITY, has made a very important move for the future in the purchase of the Robert's property on Arctic Avenue in the centre of the city, at a cost of \$8000 which will secure for us the right place for our work.

BRIDGETON, has paid off every dollar that encumbered the property, and hopes to begin the erection of the new church building in the coming year.

BRONX, our New York City mission has had a hard, but under the circumstances, a successful year. Under the careful training of the pastor, it has developed a good Sunday School and choir, and the appearance of the room occupied is very attractive, something not always characteristic of our mission work in the great cities.

BURLINGTON has had a hard year, owing in part to its unsettled condition and the changes in the pastorate. The work there is still in an uncertain condition, and in fact it has never been much of a success owing to the fact that a small colored population is divided between half a dozem churches, when there should be but one or two. The pastor has worked hard, but the results are disappointing.

FERRY AVENUE, CAMDEN, comes up with one of the best reports in her history: benevolent collections in full, 33 conversions, 18 accessions, and one of the most beautiful parsonages in the Conference, built and attractively furnished in this year.

CAPE MAY has a pastor who is in his element especially in the development of the spiritual work among our people, and his work of this year simply repeats the successes of former years. Conversions 24, and accessions 20, is a welcome addition to the rather small number enrolled here at Cape May.

BROOKLYN has an eagerly enthusiastic people, who only need a proper building to equal some of our best mission work in the city across the river. A devoted pastor, an honored graduate of Drew, whose brilliantly educated brain shows no indication of running away with his consecrated heart, he is eminently fitted for the difficult work of our city missions, and 1 am sincerely praying that "his tribe may increase." Newman Memorial is steadily forging to the front, and profiting by the mistakes of former years.

ST. DANIEL'S, CHESTER, like all of our northern city work, has suffered greatly by the financial depression, but under the skillful leadership of the present pastor, it comes up with an excellent report; every department of the church is in good working order, and a grand revival came to bless the church in its weakest moment which resulted in 15 conversions and 45 accessions.

SILOAM, CHESTER, this church has been beautifully renovated inside and out, and now presents a spectacle of real beauty. A new parsonage has been bought, the Sunday School work has been paid special attention, and the work at Swathmore has been organized into a flourishing mission.

FORDSVILLE began the year under very discouraging circumstances, but it has since retrieved itself grandly. It is my earnest conviction that much of the credit is due to the glorious revival which ushered in the New Year, and added to the small number of this heroic, but discouraged band; 19 converts and 24 accessions were the harvest. The church property freed from debt at last.

GOSHEN AND WHITESBORO, this Charge desires to be changed to "Swainton and Whitesboro," after the post office designation. The pastor, a supply, has acquired the unfortunate reputation of being able to do more work on less money than any man I ever knew. It is the glory of most pastors to be able to plant one church in their lifetime, but this faithful worker comes up to Conference this year, with two beautiful churches erected and nearly completed on this, one of the hardest fields in Southern New Jersey. He has the true missionary spirit in him, which is conquering the world for Christ. He is as modest as he is able, and while he may never be honored with a degree from our institutions of learning, he is laboring day and night to hear the "Well done, good and faithful servant" from Him who sitteth on the throne, when his work is over.

GRENLOCH, has done excellent work this year, in all the departments of the Church. Money has been raised and banked to improve the building at Grenloch, and the general condition of the work shows that it is in excellent hands for its future development.

HUDSON, N. Y. Our furtherest Northern point has been blessed with quite a revival during the year, raising its small membership to 67, and 5 probationers. The costly and needed work of repairing the church building has at last been completed and paid for, until it is one of the neatest and most beautiful of our smaller houses of worship. It is a long way off, but good when you get there.

MAGNOLIA brings up a good report in advance of last year, despite the protracted illness of its pastor.

MERCHANTVILLE has a good loyal people, but there can be no help for the future of the town until sufficient public interest is felt by its residents to banish those miserable saloons located in the colored quarter, almost next door to the church, which have given to Merchantville one of the worst reputations for crime and lawlessness held by any small town in the state. With the colored people banished to a part of the town, with no disposition to improve the locality, it has become a crying shame to this thriving suburb of Camden, but I look for no relief, until the respectable white residents of the town, join hands with the colored churches to wipe out this bitter disgrace, the saloon, from the churches and homes of our people. But the present condition of affairs in Merchantville is the inevitable result of the segregation of our people; "Out of sight, out of mind," is true of the respectable part of the white people of this place.

MONTCLAIR has spent this year \$150 on improving the parsonage and church and raised \$600 on old debt. 20 conversions and 30 accessions mark her spiritual life and fervor, while every department of the church has taken on new vigor to meet the new and unexpected demands.

MORRISVILLE has been doing heroic work of late, and has convinced us that the Bishop should grant her prayer to be allowed to return to her former state and become a station; in accordance with the request of these devoted people, I have asked that Woodbury be detached from its present position of a station, and North Camden be added to make a Circuit.

MOUNT HOLLY is splendidly organized, and the work was progressing finely until the general depression of the year overtook our people in Mount Holly, and made it doubtful for a time, if the church could ever recover. \$150 was raised and some much needed improvements were made, but there was no corresponding rally in spiritual matters. It was certainly not the fault of the energetic pastor, for a discouraged people will make any work drag.

NEWARK. This church has had the saddest experience in its history this present year.

There were rumors affecting the character of the pastor, Rev. Dr. S. S Jolly, and I deemed it necessary to have the case thoroughly invetigated by a competent committee, and the provisions of the Discipline complied with.

The Committee consisted of C. A. Tindley, Chairman; J. H. Nutter, M.

V. Waters, J. C. Dunn, W. S. Brown, and met on the 22nd of Sept., 1908, in St. John's Church, Newark, N. J.

Wt J. Moore acted as Counsel for the Church, and J. H. Scott for the defense. M. C. Jennings, Secretary. After a prolonged session of seventeen hours, continuously, the Committee retired and after careful consideration brought in a finding that

"We, the Committee in the case of the Church vs. S. S. Jolly, after careful investigation and consideration of the evidence, report that Specifications 1, 2, 3, are not sustained. Second, the charge as a whole is not sustained by a vote of Ayes, 5; Nays, 0."

The case has been submitted to the finding of a police judge and recently before a Judge of the Criminal Court in the County of Essex, and each of the trials found nothing against the defendant; it is proper to state that in each case except the first the case was investigated at the request of Bro. Jolly. The papers containing the evidence and proceedings in the case are placed as the law directs in the hands of the Conference Secretary.

During this fiercely contested trial and the storm of unfriendly comment, it is to be noted that the action of the Official Board sustained the pastor, and the best evidence of that is the splendid report that Newark sends up this year, \$3700 raised for all purposes, and the unanimity with which they ask his return.

Conversions, 26; accessions, 41. \$328 paid on old debt; \$180 on improvements; the largest Epworth League on the District. Benevolent collections raised and paid, the church seems to be intent on making up for the lost time.

OCEAN CITY AND PLEASANTVILLE, has had a year of great improvement and success. Macedonia at Ocean City has been beautified by the introduction of electric lighting, and two building lots have been purchased at Pleasantville and the old church moved from its country home nearer to where the most of the people reside. The work is moving on finely and everybody seems encouraged by the new order of the things. \$741 paid on old debt.

ORANGE has several improvements to receive our consideration; the new \$1,000 pipe organ speaks for itself, and is a constant inspiration to the choir of St. John's. \$528 raised this year for improvements.

OSSINNING has had 26 conversions and 15 accessions. \$641 has been expended for renovating the church.

CALVARY, PHILADELPHIA. This great church has had a year of unparallelled success. The financial situation has been ably handled and all interest payments promptly met. Calvary reports 210 conversions and

251 accessions, and every department of the church in excellent working order; benevolent collections met and \$4,500 paid on old debt. The membership has increased to the total of 1729 members and probationers. The success of this mammoth enterprise shows the wisdom of giving our city churches room to grow, for Calvary is a mighty power in the life of our people in Philadelphia.

FRANKFORD met a staggering blow in the death of the pastor only a few days after Conference. His place was taken by A. F. Ennals, who has succeeded in bringing up a very creditable report, amid many discouragements, and the continued illness of his wife who has been confined to her room since the last of December, and still remains very ill. The Charge has done well for the year under these circumstances.

GERMANTOWN has had a great year, benevolences in full and in excess of last year, showing that its able pastor leaves nothing omitted or undone. Its Sunday School and Epworth League work and especially the work among the Childrens' Classes is unsurpassed in excellence on the District. Under the circumstances one cannot wonder that Gerwantown has reached a point of perfection which is not only remarkable, but so uniform as to insure its future.

Converts, 7; accessions, 20; raised on old debt, \$487; improvements, \$110, with a new brick pavement in front of the church, and new chandeliers inside.

HAVEN. The Board of Home Missions and Church Extension Society deserves the hearty thanks of all lovers of Methodism among us for their courage and faith, as evidenced in the securing by its help the beautiful church at the corner of 23rd and Oxford Streets for Haven congregation; no people and pastor better deserved such friends, and this was the opportunity of a life time for the colored people of North Philadelphia to develope a great church in that section of the city. It is not necessary for me to dwell on its beauty and complete adaptation for our needs, as the pastor and officials send you a hearty invitation to hold the next session of the Delaware Conference in their beautiful home. I hope you will come and see how Methodism is forging to the front in the Quaker City. Haven has risen to the situation and beside fully meeting her financial burdens she sends up a good spiritual and benevolent report.

JOHN WESLEY has been seriously afflicted during the year by the serious illness of the pastor's family, and under the circumstances it was hardly to be expected that their report would equal the usual showing.

SOMERVILLE has had to bear the brunt of the unusually hard labor conditions in this part of our work, and the report from Somerville is much to the credit of this sadly distressed people. The people are most all employed on the city streets, and have been out of work since last November.

ST. PAUL'S. The growing need of a church in the section of South Philadelphia for our people is met by this growing work which closes its year's work with a good report. ZOAR gave the new pastor a hearty welcome, and the entire year has been characterized by devoted labor to meet the Church's requirements; handicapped as the Church was by the pastor's absence of a month at the General Conference, and an illness of several weeks following, the officials and members appreciated the situation and nobly answered every call of their beloved pastor. Converts 78; accessions 90; old debts paid, \$650, and \$209 expended on improvements; collections taken and the work moving grandly in every department. Old Mother Zoar answers the roll call once more with a splendid report.

ROSSVILLE has been declining in membership for some years until at last only 9 remain, and of these the majority are over 70 years of age. I recommend that this place be united with Brooklyn hereafter.

SALEM has had one of the best years of its history; the parsonage has been fully completed and even a capable mistress installed therein to furnish it completely. Extensive improvements have been made to the property. Conversions, 9; and accessions, 8; raised on old debt, \$120, and improvements, \$370, all show the steady progress Salem is making.

SALEM CIRCUIT also has taken to the new and improved style of furnishing a parsonage, that is to secure a good wife to oversee it. Converts, 12; accessions, 14; and something raised for all benevolences.

SPRING LAKE at the very beginning of a new season was totally destroyed by fire. Insurance was totally inadequate to replace the beautiful structure we had occupied for years, but a fortunate chance enabled us to secure the former Roman Catholic Church, which was moved on our lot and now stands ready for our use and service. As it is much larger in seating capacity than the former building, in that respect our loss was also our gain, and while the new church came too late to enable us to make up the losses of the season, it is there all ready for a great work in the coming year.

WHITE PLAINS has at last her decks cleared for the building of the much needed new church; the location is an ideal one, very convenient, and desirable, a people all enthusiastic over the coming prospect of victory, we see a very bright prospect ahead for White Plains.

WOODBURY has stood alone for the past two years, and earnestly desires a union with North Camden which will be to the advantage of both points.

We are closing a year unparallelled in the history of the Philadelphia District in its record of affliction in the homes of the pastors; how any men could do such heroic work with bruised and broken hearts can only be explained by remembering that He has promised to give us "strength according as our day shall be." The District Superintendent, who was called upon to share with his brethren in affliction, can never in words thank them for their effectual help to him during the few weeks he was unable to give the District Conferences his supervision. Only one death for the year is

reported from this District, that of T. M. Hubbard, but it was the fall of a master in Israel. It was properly noticed in the memorial service.

The one great event of the year is our securing a beautiful and commodious place of worship in North Philadelphia for Haven. There is so little meanness and envy in the brethren of this District that we are all shouting happy over this piece of good luck which has come to our sister church.

It has been a year of spiritual growth also; with 700 conversions, and 800 accessions, we now number 4925 full members and 900 probationers, a total membership of 5825. The Sunday School army now enrolls officers and teachers, 450; pupils, 4764, a total of 5214. The Epworth League membership is: Senior, 1460; Junior, 605, a total of 2465. We also have 20 Ladies' Aid organizations with 619 members.

\$17,357 has been paid on old debt and improvements, leaving a present debt remaining of \$124,417 on property valued at \$260,000; this will give some idea of the heavy burdens laid upon this growing and progressive District.

\$850 was raised for Foreign Missions, and \$805 for the Home Board. Freedmen's Aid, \$250, and Carnegie Fund, \$300, Conference Claimants, \$450.

I cannot vouch for the correctness of these figures as long as some pastors do not make any report of their collections and other statistics in time to give the people of thier Charge credit for the work done. I would gladly do so, but a District Superintendent cannot succeed in giving accurate figures when none are furnished him, nor do what Israel in Egypt could not do: make bricks without straw.

Thanking God for the measure of health given me to undertake this hard task, and for the constancy and loyal support of the pastors, I submit this statement of the year's work on the Philadelphia District.

SALISBURY DISTRICT.

BISHOP AND BRETHREN:-

The report of the Salisbury District for the year just ended is far below our desire and our effort. The failure in the collections which we report with sorrow, is due mainly to the poor crops and the breaking down of the oyster inductry, in our section. In things spiritual, we can speak more cheeringly. The most of the churches have had revivals. And some of these were remarkable for the breadth of sweep, the number of conversions, and the general quickening that attended them. The pastors are trying to teach the people "even as truth is in Jesus: that ye put away, as concerning your former manner of life, the old man, that waxeth corrupt

after the lusts of deceit; and that ye be renewed in the spirit of your mind, and put on the new man, that after God hath been re-created in righteousness and holiness of truth." The emphasis in preaching is placed on character, the life, rather than on the feelings. The emotional formalism which dulls the sense of the divine, soothes the guilty conscience, weakens the intellect, and intoxicates the sensibility, is no longer taken for spirituality. On the contrary, those who claim to have been enabled by the Holy Spirit in the mystery of regeneration to see the invisible, to hear the inaudible, to feel the intangible, to realize the unimaginable, to envisage that which transcends reason itself, are taught that they have the power, and are under obligation to bring forth not only one of the fruits of the Spirit, but all the fruits of the Spirit, as "love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, meekness, self-control." We rejoice to say that this teaching is bearing fruit unto holiness, whose end is eternal life.

There has been some sickness and deaths this year. Father W. H. Johnson of Fairmount, received his coronation July 26, 1908; and brother E. D. Havens died at Suffolk, Va., the home of his wife, Dec. 24. Brother L. T. Robbins lost a daughter of six years.

You will be pleased to know that the mortgage for \$200, which stood against the District Parsonage for 23 years, since 1885, has been paid off from the Church Aid Fund; and now the parsonage is free, a pleasant home for the Superintendent of the Salisbury District.

There is another matter of interest which I beg leave to mention, because it shows most impressively how the races may live in peace together. It is a splendid example of generosity and Christian kindness, where law, cold business, and the race feeling dictated, and would have justified the contrary course. Some of the principal streets of Salisbury were recently paved, the property holders on them being assessed to pay the cost of the improvement. Many of our people own good properties on some of these streets, John Wesley Church and its parsonage being among them. The total assessment of the property thus owned was \$4,000. To pay this individual assessment would have been to each one, even the best off, a heavy burden; and to others, it would have meant either scrious crippling Those affected sent a committee, headed by Mr. S. T. Houston. to present their grievances to the city council, and to ask for reduction or They were received by the council with respect and sympathy; but were told that they must pay or lose all. But the march of progress which so often leaves the feeble and incompetent stripped, wounded, and dazed in the rear, was so dominated by the Spirit of the Man of Galilee, that the proposition made by one member of the council to leave these poor colored men to their fate, to proceed at once to take from them that which they were not able to keep in the new conditions, was instantly rejected by the rest of the council. At the suggestion of Mr. W. B. Miller, one of the members, Mr. Houston solicited aid from the white citizens to save our people's Mr. Miller himself headed the list with \$200, Mr. W. H. Jackson and his son, Mr. W. P. Jackson, gave \$250 each, the W. L. Gunby Hardware Company gave \$75, and others gave smaller amounts till a total of \$1215 had been collected. This amount was divided pro rata among the properties. John Wesley Church receiving \$82.43. And in addition to this, some of those gentlemen became bondsmen to the Building and Loan Association for those who could not pay out with the aid given. Such incidents glorify God, do credit to the Christian men who so beautifully exemplify the teachings of our Lord Jesus, and give hope, and a fine object lesson to the trembling colored man.

Princess Anne Academy has had a most excellent year. The enrollment is 147. Of this number all were Christians at the opening of the school year, but 20; and last month 13 more were converted, so that there are now only 7 out of 147 unsaved. The average age of the students is very low, a sure indication of the growth of right views on the subject of education. The intellectual activity, harmony, and moral tone of the school are at the highest point. There has not been one case of immorality reported this year. The rebellions that were formerly so frequent have ceased entirely. Prof. Trigg says he has never had a better school in his thirty-five years as a teacher.

We very much regret that so little, only \$819.25, of the Carnegie Endowment Fund, apportioned our District, was raised. While the financial condition of the whole country must bear a part of the blame for this failure, there is good ground for the fear that a few of the pastors and many of the people do not sympathize with the cause. They seem not to comprehend the situation of our race. They do not realize that Christian Education is the efficient handmaid of religion, the lamp by which virtue directs her upward way. It drives out superstition and fear; produces courage and humility; and makes a man feel at home in his Father's house. It enlarges and enriches personality; and multiplies the means of social intercourse; and increases social comity and efficiency. It is a constant revelation of the glory and holiness of God; whereby the soul is moved to adoration and deeper consecration. Well does Tennyson sing:

"Who loves not knowledge? Who shall rail Against her beauty? May she mix With men and prosper! Who shall fix Her pillars? Let her work prevail."

And again.

"For knowledge is of things we see; And yet we trust it comes from Thee, A beam in darkness: let it grow.

Let knowledge grow from more to more, But more of reverence in us dwell; That mind and soul, according well, May make one music as before. But vaster."

The wisdom of God saith of herself: "It cannot be gotten for gold, neither shall silver be weighed for the price thereof. It cannot be valued with the gold of Ophir, with the precious onyx, or the sapphire. Gold and glass cannot equal it, neither shall it be exchanged for jewels of fine gold.

No mention shall be made of coral or of crystal: yea the price of wisdom is above rubies. The topaz of Ethiopia shall not equal it, neither shall it be valued with pure gold." "Doth not wisdom cry, and understanding put forth her voice?" "Receive my instruction, and not silver and knowledge rather than choice gold. For wisdom is better than rubies; and all the things that may be desired are not to be compared unto it."

BOX IRON. P. W. Price has spent two years of self-sacrificing labor on this very difficult work. Measured by the adverse circumstances with which he has contended, none deserve higher commendation than he. Raised on old debts, \$478.63. Benevolences, \$44. Carnegie Fund, \$7; total \$51. Conversions, 21; accessions, 21.

CHINCOTEAGUE. Supplied by brother S. T. Drummond of Pocomoke City. He has done well on the island. Raised on old debts, \$12; improvements, \$3.50; total, \$15.50. Benevolences, \$16. Conversion, 1; accession, 1.

COTTAGE GROVE. Supplied by brother J. W. Waters. The new church at Cottage Grove is well under way, and when completed will equal the best on the District. Raised on new building, \$525. Benevolences, \$131; Carnegie Fund, \$80; total \$211. Conversions, 33; accessions, 15.

CRISFIELD. R. G. Waters. In addition to doing a good work in his church, Brother Waters has stirred up an unwonted interest in the public school. The town will erect a new building for our young people. And more interesting still, the Trustees of the Jeans' Bequest for Rural Schools for colored children, have been induced to take the school on their list. They are now paying the salary of a teacher, and will furnish a teacher of industries hereafter. Well done! Raised on old debts, \$700; improvements, \$200. Benevolences, \$152; Carnegie Fund, \$25; total \$177. Conversions, 10; accessions, 25.

DAMES QUARTER. W. A. Hubbard. The people are away from home the greater part of the year seeking work, and the church suffers as a result. This year has been more than ordinarily hard. Raised on old debt, \$100; on improvements, \$85; total \$185. Benevolences, \$40, \$1 more than last year. Conversions, 15; accessions, 4.

DEALS ISLAND. P. T. Scott. What has been said of the condition at Dames Quarter applies to this Charge. The people are pleased with brother Scott, and are very sorry that they have not been able to fill all the blanks in their report. But they have done their best. Raised on improvements, \$28. Benevolences, \$49; Carnegie Fund, \$1; total \$50. Conversions, 58; accessions, 56.

EXMORE. L. D. Beecham. The church at Exmore has been renovated, and the people are greatly encouraged. Both of the churches have now been renewed, and the membership and congregations increased. Raised on old debts, \$215; improvements, \$90; total \$305. Benevolences, \$51; Carnegle Fund, \$2; total \$53. Conversions, 76; accessions, 57.

FAIRMOUNT. A. L. Henry. Brother Henry has accomplished here that which has been the dream of years, namely, the building of a church ir the midst of the people of the Upper Hill. The church, a cozy structure, is completed, and in use. It cost about \$4,000. Thus to brother Henry belongs the credit of settling a question that has puzzled many pastors and Presiding Elders. Raised on old debts, \$93; new building, \$810. Benevolences, \$133. Conversions, 62; accessions, 40.

FRUITLAND. D. A. Rideout. The work has prospered greatly and the pastor and people are mutually pleased. Some of the old members say the work is now at its best. Raised for old debts, \$72; improvements, \$35; total \$107. Benevolences, \$123; Carnegie Fund, \$12; total \$135. Conversions, 36; accessions, 24.

GREENWOOD. Supplied by R. H. Boggs. This work, though small, is alive. The people are pleased with brother Boggs. Raised on old debts, \$70; improvements, \$10; total \$80. Benevolences, \$60; Carnegie Fund, \$10; total \$70. Conversions, 17.

HOPEWELL. C. Y. Trigg. The general financial depression has greatly affected the work here. Brother Trigg is to be highly commended for the persistent and courageous effort he has made to better the moral and religious life of his people. Raised on improvements, \$61.47; new building, \$120; total \$182.47. Benevolences, \$68; Carnegie Fund, \$12; total \$80. Conversions, 14; accessions, 12.

JAMESTOWN. J. E. A. D. Grigsby. Brother Grigsby ends three years of remarkable success for Jamestown. He is unsurpassed as a financier, and his spiritpal and moral value is great. Raised on old debts, \$580; improvements, \$220; total \$800. Benevolences, \$75, an increase of \$11. Carnegie Fund, \$5. Conversions, 30; accessions, 31.

LAWSONIA. J. A. Jeffers. The Sunday School of this church has a cradle roll of 51 little ones, the only cradle roll I know of anywhere among our people. The Ladies' Aid Society, the greatest on the District, is the main financial agency of the church. The special event of the year was the purchase of a fine lot of land adjoining the white people's cemetery for a burial ground for the colored people of that community. The cost was \$600. Raised on old debts, \$203.16. Benevolences, \$139. Carnegie Fund \$25; total \$164. Conversions, 4; accessions, 4.

LEEMONT. J. H. Winters. The work has made steady progress during the three years of brother Winters' pastorate. Raised on old debts, \$547; improvements, \$40; total \$587. Benevolences, \$119; Carnegie Fund \$53; total \$172. Conversions, 30; accessions, 40.

MARION STATION. L. E. Toulson. A good report is sent though the financial stringency is keenly felt here. Raised on old debts, \$400; improvements, \$105; new building, \$190; total \$690. Benevolences, \$110; Carnegie Fund, \$20; total \$130. Conversions, 26; accessions, 21. Pastor and wife for Carnegie Fund, \$8.

MARION CIRCUIT, has been supplied by brother N. D. Scott, who has done a creditable work. The work has grown. Raised on old debts, \$229.83; Benevolences, \$25; Carnegie Fund, \$11.50; total \$36.50. Conversions 12: accessions 16.

MOUNT VERNON. W. T. Purnell. Brother Purnell being near the Academy, is studying there. He is successful in his studies, and has advanced the two churches of his Charge in a marked degree, both spiritually and financially. Raised on old debts, \$181.56; improvements, \$71.08; tctal \$252.64. Benevolences, \$93; Carnegie Fund, \$49; total \$142. Conversions, 79; accessions, 82. The benevolences were raised in full here for the first time in the history of the church.

NANTICOKE. C. E. Hemsley. Brother Hemsley has had a hard year by reason of sickness in his family and the scarcity of work and money. He has shown true Christian fortitude in the midst of afflictions, and has wrought a memorable spiritual work for the church, having conducted a revival in which 170 persons were converted and reclaimed. ORIOLE. J. W. W. Cox. So many of the people of this Charge are without work that I am surprised that anything was raised for the general work of the church. The spiritual interests are well in hand, many have been converted. Raised on old debts, \$80; improvements, \$12; total \$92. Benevolences, \$40; Carnegie Fund, \$5; total, \$45. Conversions, 66; accessions, 61.

PARSONBURG. E. E. Rogers. He ends his sixth year on this work with the largest reports in the history of the work. Raised on old debts, \$110; improvements, \$85; total \$195. Benevolences, \$96. Conversions, 41; accessions, 41.

POCOMOKE CITY. M. L. McKenny. The church is united and joyfully working with brother McKenny in every department. Raised on old debts, \$500; improvements, \$300; total \$800. Benevolences, \$134; Carnegie Fund, \$60; total \$194. Conversions, 12; accessions, 26.

PRINCESS ANNE. W. E. Waters. This Charge has reached under brother Waters the climax of its history. It is united, active, and rejoicing in a revival that brought 84 persons to Christ, and 83 into the church. Sister Waters has been sick the greater part of the year, but the pastor's spirit was undaunted, as his report shows. Raised on old debts, \$207; improvements, \$50; total \$257. Benevolences, \$165; Carnegie Fund, \$50; total \$216.

PRINCESS ANNE CIRCUIT. Supplied by C. T. Covington. Brother Covington is doing the wise thing, he is attending Princess Anne Academy, and is doing good work with his books and with his people. Raised on old debts, \$25; improvements, \$20; total \$45. Benevolences, \$____; Carnegie Fund, \$____; total \$____. Conversions, 7; accessions, 4.

QUANTICO. W. C. Bowland. The people of Quantico value brother Bowland's ministry very highly; the work is prosperous, though the people are not so well off temporally as they have been in former years. Raised on old debts, \$85. Benevolences, \$60; Carnegie Fund, \$13 for the church and \$2 for the pastor; total, \$75. Conversions, 8; accessions, 10.

SALISBURY. C. S. Sprigg. All the benevolences are reported full, the whole amounting to \$216; Carnegie Fund, \$59; total, \$275. Raised on old debts, \$112; improvements, \$290. Conversions, 6; accessions, 9. Brother Sprigg's return for the third year is desired by his people.

SALISBURY CIRCUIT. J. L. Parker. The membership of the largest church on the work, Whites Chapel, is small, but very heroic. They and brother Parker have wrought well. The new church has been dedicated, and has been attracting the people. The other churches on the work are doing their part well. Raised on old debts, \$367.10; improvements, \$78.16. Benevolences, \$31; Carnegie Fund, church \$10, pastor \$5; total \$15. Conversions, 21; accessions, 8.

SNOW HILL. L. W. Deakins. With evenness and skill, the pastor carries his work successfully forward. Raised on old debts, \$200. Benevolences, \$150; Carnegie Fund, \$68; total \$218. Conversions, 30; accessions, 28.

SNOW HILL CIRCUIT. Supplied by brother C. H. Spencer. The people are filled with gratitude and joy by the work of brother Spencer for them. They felt until he went to them that they were lightly esteemed; now they feel that they are regarded as being of some account, and though few in number and poor, they are equal to the best in their work. Brother Spencer has showed them both why and how to be. Raised on old debts, \$13; improvements, \$12; total \$25. Benevolences, \$52; Carnegie Fund, church \$25, pastor \$5; total Carnegie Fund \$30; total Benevolences and Carnegie Fund, \$82. Conversions, 5; accessions, 7.

STOCKTON. C. L. Anderson. Stockton reports only \$56 for the Benevolences, a deficit of \$47 as compared with last year. We all know brother Anderson and we know Stockton. I am sure that both pastor and people have done what they could. They merit praise, not censure. They

have had a good revival, and have done very well with their building. Raised on old debts, \$146; improvements, \$200; new building \$250; total \$596. Conversions, 41; accessions, 46.

UNIONVILLE. E. H. Nichols. A good work has been accomplished. Raised on old debts, \$209; improvements, \$30; total \$239. Benevolences, \$80. Conversions, 14; accessions, 21. Carnegie Fund, \$1.75.

WACHAPREAGUE. L. J. Waters. The report is excellent. Raised on old debts, \$10; improvements, \$131; new building, \$50; total, \$191. Benevolences, \$78; Carnegie Fund, \$55; total \$133. Conversions, 72; accessions, 45.

WATTSVILLE. J. S. Coulbourne. The people are greatly improved under brother Coulbourne's ministry. Raised on old debts, \$488; improvements, \$147; total \$635. Benevolences, \$123; Carnegie Fund, \$60; total \$183. Conversions, 28; accessions, 48.

WETIPQUIN. I. T. Robbins. Being a mechanic, brother Robbins moved the old church building to a good lot recently bought, and so remodeled it as to make a very attractive and comfortable parsonage of it. He has had much sickness in his family, lost a daughter of six, and was down some weeks himself; but his report is excellent. Raised on old debts, \$150; improvements, \$100; new building, \$500; total \$750. Benevolences, \$60; Carnegie Fund, \$13; total \$73. Conversions, 65.

WHITE HAVEN. M. P. Sterling. The most that can be said of White Haven proper is, that it needs the Holy Spirit to convict it of sin, of right-eousness, and of judgement. The church at New Town manifests more of the fruits of the Spirit. Brother Sterling has labored with some success. The people are building a beautiful church at White Haven. Raised on old debts, \$25; new building, \$600; total \$625. Benevolences, \$34; Carnegie Fund, \$4; total \$38. Conversions, 13; accessions, 13.

SUMMARY.—Total conversions, 1246; probationers, ——; accessions, 1165. Total raised for old debts, improvements, and new buildings, \$12,-600.49; raised for the benevolences, \$2984. Raised for the Carnegie Endowment Fund, \$796. We are saddened by this unavoidable failure. We are willing to try again.

WILMINGTON DISTRICT.

BISHOP AND BRETHREN: -

We are thankful to Him who has called us to the ministry, that our number has not been diminished by death, and that there have been only two instances in which the work has suffered by reason of protracted illness of the workmen. Brother W. H. Turner has suffered intensely with inflammatory rheumatism, and Bro. J. M. Whittington had a severe attack of pneumonia.

Sister Rhoda Jefferson, the mother of our brother, J. W. Jefferson, on June 22, 1908, slipped from the tender embrace of her loved ones and joined the disembodied saints. Sister Annie M. Elbert, widow of the Rev. J. D. Elbert, and mother of the late Rev. I. J. Elbert, departed this life Jan. 1, 1909. She was a loving, large-hearted christian, and will be remembered for her generosity.

The kindness of my predecessor, in supplying necessary information relating to the affairs of the District, enabled me to begin my work without the least embarrassment. Pastors and laymen received me most kindly, and pledged me their earnest efforts to make this the banner year for the Wilmington District. Whether they have realized their intentions, I know not, but I am fully persuaded that the majority of them have made sacrifices, experienced anxieties, endured hardships and labored assiduously that the end desired be attained.

Temperance.

The temperance cause is steadily gaining ground among us. Its advocates are multiplying and working with greater zeal. Since the Temperance Educational Campaign in Delaware, making possible the state's partial victory over the saloon, the people are beginning to see more clearly, that the saloon is really a school of crime, a fountain of social misery, and a cesspool of political corruption. Whether Prohibition prohibits or not, moral conditions invariably improve when saloon-keepers are forced out of business. Drunkenness is diminished, gambling loses many of its charms and profanity is not so frequently heard. Answering the question: "How came Georgia to go dry?" a woman addressing a Wilmington audience said: "We prayed and Christians rallied to the Temperance Standard." If victory for Temperance is to be achieved on the line indicated, then Christians should be more earneest in prayer, and more vigorously set themselves to the task of dealing the knock-out blow to the saloon.

Sunday School and Epworth League.

These organizations as a rule, answer their purposes far better in the large towns and cities than they do in the country. But the results obtained in either city or country, seem a very poor compensation for the efforts which are being put forth to teach our children the Scriptures, and to train our young people for future usefulness. Scarcely one third of the children living in the rural part of our District attend Sunday School twenty times

a year. Immediately following Children's Day, many Sunday Schools take a vacation which generally lasts until the first Sunday in October. The attendance is fair during October and November, but small during the winter.

There are eighteen Epworth League Chapters and ten Junior Leagues on the District. Of this number seven Senior and five Junior Leagues are doing commendable work. The rest are Leagues in name only.

Our Sunday School and Epworth League Convention held June 18th and 19th, 1908, at Middletown, Del., was considered a great success. The attendance was large, the songs were inspiring, the papers and discussions were interesting, and the addresses delivered by District Superintendents, P. O'Connell and J. Raymond Brown were remarkable productions, and occassioned a similar enthusiasm. We were greatly helped.

Ladies' Aid Society.

The Ladies' Aid Society is signally accomplishing the purpose of its existence by promoting the social and financial interest of the church. Its work appeals to the women of the church. Its membership is steadily increasing. It is growing more and more in popular favor.

Prayer Meetings and Revivals.

It is indeed lamentable that so many of our members are neglecting these means of grace. They are divided as to methods of conducting prayer meetings and revivals. Some like to sing home made rhymes, "use vain repetitions as the heathen do; for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking," and they are fixed in their ways. They are opposed to the Spiritual Department of the Epworth League. They regard it as an effort to supplant their methods. There are others, a number by far too small for this enlightened day, who search the Scriptures, use the Methodist Hymnal and other Song Books especially prepared for Praise and Revival Services. The former class mentioned makes the noise, but this, the latter is doing the work.

It was my pleasure to participate in a revival service held in one of our churches during February. The audience was supplied with Bibles and Hymn Books, the Scriptures were read and commented on and the organ accompanied the singing. In that meeting believers rejoiced, and unbelievers were convicted of sin and converted to God. The power of God was there. When that special revival service concluded, 35 persons had professed faith in God, and the majority of them were between the ages of 25 and 50 years.

Education.

"What would the Methodist Episcopal Militant Church have done without its schools?" asked a bishop of the Methodist Church. It would have accomplished but little. A church without a school means a religion without intelligence, and such a religion is like Sampson shorn of his locks, and it soon degenerates into a vague sentimentalism. The church and the school cannot be separated. It was given the church to instruct the people. The prophets were among the first and most reliable teachers. Nichodemus ad-

dressed the Head of the Church as a "teacher sent from God." And Christ the Head of the Church "seeing the multitudes, He went up into a mountain; and when He was set His disciples came unto Him, and He opened His mouth and taught them." Mr. Andrew Carnegie's conditional gift of \$50,000 to Morgan College has afforded us an unusual opportunity to place on the hearts of our people the importance of Christian Education and their obligation to support our church schools. On the Wilmington District, there are five students attending our church schools. The number is small because the majority of our young people find it more convenient to attend the Delaware State College, for Colored Students, located near Dover, Del. This school is doing a good work. Thirty of its graduates are teach-Dr. W. C. Jason, a member of this Conference, is the ing in the state. principal. Rural educational conditions are deplorable. Small salaries and short terms do not induce competent young men and women to teach in the country. The people in no sense realize the importance of education. They are but little concerned whether their children attend school or not. A very few of them have the slightest apprehension of the perilous consequences of ignorance. Most of them "love darkness rather than light, because their deeds are evil." Thirty years ago honesty and simplicity characterized the countryman. Parents shuddered when their sons and daughters forsook the farm for the city, fearing that they might fall among thieves, or take on habits incompatible with their home training. things have changed, the city is guilty of no crime but what is practiced, perhaps more defiantly, in the country. In the city wickedness, fearing the law, shuns the light, but in the country it is bold enough to sell whiskey, carouse and gamble on church premises and on public highways. We bail with joy the special interest which the National Government is taking in rural social conditions.

Dr. Noble, the newly elected president of Woman's College, Baltimore, said in his Inaugural Address, "No philosophy of society is respectable that does not emphasize education as fundamental." But educational efforts are greatly handicapped where order is not observed and the law not upheld.

Charges.

BARCLAY has done a better work than was foreshadowed in the beginning. Then, the people appeared indifferent and the pastor discouraged. But in October the work took on new life. Raised on old debts, \$150; Conference collections, \$60. A. W. Lewber, pastor.

CATLIN enjoys the reputation of doing what it promises, but it is most careful that its obligations shall never come near equalling its strength. Raised on old debts, \$50; for improvements, \$80; Benevolences full. Carnegie Fund, \$2. M. W. Clark, pastor.

CHESWOLD is a difficult Charge to pastor. The people are able to support a pastor and pay the benevolences, but they are not very willing to do either. Conference collections, \$37; improvements, \$88. S. Hammond, pastor.

CRUMPTON'S greatest need is a revival. For this has the faithful pastor worked and prayed, but it tarries. Raised on old debts, \$140; Conference collections, \$70. J. K. Adams, pastor.

DELAWARE CITY justly feels unequal to the task of supporting a pastor with a large family, but it has shown its willingness. Raised on old debts, \$104; Conference collections, \$72; Carnegie Fund, \$21. Accessions, 2. T. B. H. Coleman, pastor.

DOVER is a well organized Charge with an active Sunday School and Epworth League. Cordial relations exist between pastor and people, and his return is greatly desired. Raised on old debts, \$103; for improvements, \$55; Conference collections, \$135; Carnegie Fund, \$30. Accessions 11. E. H. Webb, pastor.

DOVER CIRCUIT is weak but willing. It is remarkable that this Charge of 50 members, with the most limited means of livelihood, has raised for the benevolences, \$50; Carnegie Fund, \$13. Accessions, 5. S. W. Waters, pastor.

GALENA has not slackened its pace. There are two churches on this Charge and they are quite alive. Sunday Schools, Epworth and Junior Leagues are real forces operating for the elevation of the young especially. The leader of these people has their fullest confidence because he can bring things to pass. A new church costing \$1,300 has been built at Davis Hill, and \$580 have been paid on the same. Raised on old debts, \$430; Conference collections, \$100; Carnegie Fund, \$30. Accessions, 24. J. W. Jefferson, pastor.

MARYDEL, once styled the "Garden spot of the Delaware Conference," was a real disappointment to me, and has not yet come up to my expectation. Through the persistent efforts of the present pastor, the little delapidated place where former pastors lived, has been transformed into a comfortable parsonage at a cost of \$375 and \$174 have been paid on the same. Raising said amount for improvements apparently interferred with the benevolent collections, for only \$63 have been raised. Accessions 19. W. H. Turner, pastor.

MIDDLETOWN has lost none of its characteristic vigor. It is steadily growing into prominence. Every interest of the Charge is conserved. The church has been beautifully painted at a cost of \$150. Raised on old debts \$275; Conference collections \$104; Carnegie Fund, \$10. Accessions, 6. J. U. King, pastor.

MILLINGTON, a Charge formed by uniting Chesterville and Millington, has demonstrated the wisdom of the union by success achieved. The parsonage has been repaired and painted. Raised for improvements, \$100; old debts, \$50; Conference collections, \$95. Conversions, 50; accessions, 60. A. J. Wallace, pastor.

NEW CASTLE. The people of this Charge depend almost wholly on the mills and factories for a livelihood, and these have been shut down. Some of these folks have not been able to "keep the wolf from the door." Salaries and benevolences are very far below amounts estimated and apportioned. Raised on old debts, \$50; Conference collections, \$42; Carnegie Fund, \$1. Accessions, 20. G. B. Coleman, pastor.

NEWPORT has not been strengthened by the addition of Hockessin. This church of less than 12 members has a note of \$325 in the Security Trust Fund, Wilmington, Del., due April 1, 1909. The bank will proceed to collect if a substantial payment is not made. I command no funds which can be used for that purpose, and, the people will not likely make an effort to discharge this obligation. One year ago the note was \$450, but by using \$86 of the Church Ald and Home Mission Collections, and the pastor in some way making up the balance, the note has been reduced \$125. Raised on old debts, \$50. Accessions, 10. Conference collections, \$65; Carnegie Fund, \$5. W. E. Hilton, pastor.

ODESSA has been so much concerned with local financial affairs that it has failed to discharge its duty toward the benevolent enterprises. Raised on old debts, \$100; for improvements, \$60; Conference collections, \$67. Accessions, 35. O. P. Dickerson, pastor.

PORT DEPOSIT, with its small membership, has been in a state of turmoil all the year. A petition was handed me at the First Quarterly Conference, for the removal of the pastor on the grounds of his having lost his influence among the people. EDUCATION.

The Committee on Education respectfully submit the following report:
We view with much serious concern the appalling conditions of the
public school system in some parts of our Conference territory. Some of
these conditions are the following: indifference and the lack of appreciation
of the great benefits of the public schools on the part of parents; poorly
paid teachers, which means inefficient instruction; inadequate facilities,
and the very short term of the schools.

The School Commissioners in districts where these conditions are most appalling attribute the poor equipment and short terms to the lack of funds for the public instruction of our children.

We recommend that all of our ministers use their utmost and most honorable efforts to increase the interests of parents in supporting the public schools by sending their children regularly, and also to use their influence with the School Commissioners to secure an equitable appropriation of the school funds for our schools.

We recommend Morgan College and Princess Anne Academy for the industrial, literary and religious instruction of our youth. We also highly commend the Del. State College at Dover for colored youth, for its high standing and rank among the institutions of learning in our midst. We most heartily endorse the movement to establish at the Delaware State College a Summer School of Theology, as well as a summer school for teachers, and recommend that advantage be taken of these opportunities.

We, again, pledge our support to Morgan College and its efficieent and most capable President, Dr. Spencer, in his splendid effort to meet Mr. Andrew Carnegie's conditional gift of \$50,000 to Morgan College.

SUNDAY SCHOOL.

The best Methodist Episcopalians, we believe, are those who are trained step by step to see JESUS in the character of an Almighty Allwise Redeemer whose loving kindness toward them has caused Him to willingly humble Mimself and take upon Himself our infirmities and sins to exalt us to sonship with GOD.

We believe the training of children in the Christian life and habit should begin so early in life that the child may not know when he did not love the LORD, in other words preventing sin is better, by far, than correcting it.

Again, the properly conducted Sunday School is a very efficient instructor in the things of GOD, which cannot be neglected by parents without serious, if not everlasting, detriment.

WHEREAS, The Sunday School Board of our Church requires that each Conference organize a Conference Sunday School Board to be auxiliary to the General Conference Board, we do hereby endorse the recommendation and request each District Superintendent to recommend one minister and one layman to constitute our Conference Board.

We recommend, therefore,

1. That the pastors, superintendents, and teachers feel and impressible importance of this primary and fundamental work of the Sunday School.

That the primal importance of the Sunday School is obvious from.the claim the perpetuity of the church has upon it.

3. That great care be exercised that competent and pious teachers who love the work be selected.

4. That weekly teacher and training classes be maintained.

We believe if the above is strictly observed our Sunday Schools will be brought up to great efficiency.

WILLIAM H. JOHNSON.

William H. Johnson was born in the year of our Lord 1835, at Upper Fairmount, Somerset County, Maryland, and died Sunday, 3 A. M., July 26th, 1908.

He joined the Delaware Conference at its Annual session held in Ezien Church, Wilmington, Del., Bishop Matthew Simpson, presiding.

He superannuated at his own request at the session of this Conference held at Camden, N. J., 1907, remaining in the effective work thirty-three years, serving the following charges: Forktown, 2 years; Horntown, 2 years; Deals Island, 2 years; Lewes, 2 years; Morton, 2 years; Fruitland, 2 years; Stockton, 2 years; Kingston, 1 year; Port Deposit, 2 years; Milford, 2 years; Bridgeville, 2 years; Berlin, 3 years; Townsend, 4 years; Jamestown, 2 years; Greenwood, 2 years; Hopewell, 2 years.

William H. Johnson was a man of unstained character, meek and kind, a preacher of righteousness by precept and example. He was well disposed, slow to anger, faithful and true. He leaves an aged wife and one daughter to mourn their loss.

THOMAS MATTHEW HUBBARD.

When nearly twenty-five years of age he removed to Germantown, Pa., and became the leading spirit in the formation of the present Janes M. E. Church on Haines Street. He was licensed an exhorter by the late George H. Waters, May 15, 1876; licensed a local preacher in November, and on the first day of December, upon the recommendation of the late W. J. Parker, Presiding Elder of Philadelphia District, was sent to supply Bridgeton, N. J. He was admitted on trial in the Delaware Conference in 1877, at Chestertown, Md., and appointed to New Castle, Delaware; ordained a deacon in 1879 at Cambridge, Md., and an elder in 1882 at Centreville, Md.; ordinations being confirmed by Bishop Levi Scott and Bishop R. S. Foster.

He preached the plain Gospel with power and demonstration of the Holy Spirit.

He served the Church faithfully, in every appointment many were brought into the fold through his preaching.

He labored in the following fields: Bridgeton, New Castle, South Wilmington, Port Deposit, Cape May, Smyrna, Berlin, Merchantville and Frankford.

The last, and probably the best work of his useful life in the pastorate, the great and crowning achievement of his ministerial career, was at Frankford, Penn., where he spent twelve years of willing, hard, consecrated labors for his Master.

He leaves behind a bereaved and ever faithful companion, an adopted son, an aged brother, and a host of friends to mourn their loss.

In the summer he returned to the Hospital for a short time. In September, 1908, he and his family moved to Suffolk, Va. Here he lingered until the end. Twenty days before his death, Dec. 4, 1908, his daughter, Emily, preceded him to the great beyond. He leaves a wife and six children. He rests from his labors.
