DAILY PROCEEDINGS.

FIRST DAY.

WEDNESDAY MORNING.

The Philadelphia Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church commenced its 81st session in the Union M. E. Church, Philadelphia, on Wednesday morning, March 11th, 1868, Bishop E. S. Janes presiding.

The Conference was called to order at 9 o'clock.

Religious services, consisting of reading from the 61st chapter of Isaiah, and from the 20th chapter of the Acts of the Apostles, were conducted by the Bishop.

The 215th hymn was sung. Bishop Janes led in prayer.

Robt. H. Pattison was re-elected Secretary, and G. W. Lybrand, A. M. Wiggins and S. L. Gracey, Assistants.

The roll was called, when 174 members answered to their names.

Nine o'clock A. M. was fixed as the hour for convening, and 12 o'clock M. as the hour for adjournment.

The Presiding Elders reported the nominations for the usual Standing Committees, which were on motion confirmed. (*See Standing Committees.*)

The Rules of the last session were adopted for the government of this session. (*See Rules.*)

J. B. Quigg presented a paper advocating a change in the Discipline respecting the trial of members. The paper was referred to a special committee. (*See Special Committees.*)

On motion of C. Cooke a column for contributions to the "Freedman's Aid Society," was ordered to be arranged in the Minutes.

H. M. Johnson presented the report of Dickinson College, which was referred to the Committee on Education.

On motion of J. F. Chaplain it was ordered that the Rules of Conference be hereafter published in the Minutes.

T. J. Thompson presented papers on the subject of education, which were referred to the Committee on Education.

Bishop Janes stated that the Conference was authorized to draw on the Chartered Fund for \$27. The draft was ordered.

On motion of H. M. Johnson the collections for Educational purposes were directed to be published in the Minutes.

T. C. Murphy presented a letter from Rev. J. T. Gracey, a member of the India Mission Conference, which was read. A series of resolutions was adopted. (*See letter and resolutions.*)

Question 2 of the Minutes, ("Who remain on trial?") was taken up. (*See Disciplinary Questions.*)

Question 4 of the Minutes, ("Who are the Deacons?") was taken up. (*See Disciplinary Questions.*)

Question 5 of the Minutes, ("Who have been elected and ordained Elders this year?") was taken up. (*See Disciplinary Questions.*)

The hour for adjournment having arrived, notices were given, the Doxology was sung, and prayer offered by Bishop Janes.

The benediction was pronounced by the Rev. Father Boehm.

SECOND DAY.

THURSDAY MORNING.

Religious exercises by W. Cooper.

The names of the members absent at roll call on Wednesday morning, were called.

The Minutes were read and approved.

A circular on lay representation was presented, and referred to a special committee on that subject. (*See Special Committees.*)

A communication from the President of the Wesleyan Female College, at Wilmington, was referred to the Committee on Education.

A communication respecting Drew Theological Seminary, was referred to the same committee.

A circular from the Church Extension Society, was presented, and referred to the Committee on Church Extension.

The report of the Tract Society was presented by S. W. Thomas, and referred to the Committee on Tract Cause.

A circular from Minnesota Annual Conference, respecting the Book Concern, was referred to a special committee. (*See Special Committees.*)

A communication from the Quarterly Conference of Chester station was referred to the same committee.

A communication from Irving Female College, at Mechanicsburg, Pa., was referred to the Committee on Education.

W. B. Walton was, on motion, added to the Committee on Finance.

The Stewards made their call at 10 o'clock.

A communication from the Trustees of Wesleyan Female College, was referred to the Committee on Education.

Question 3 of the Disciplinary questions, ("Who are admitted into full connection?") was taken up. (*See Disciplinary Questions.*)

Very interesting addresses were delivered to the candidates by Bishop Janes and the venerable Father Boehm, the travelling companion of Bishop Asbury.

The election for delegates to the General Conference, was made the order of the day for 10 o'clock on Friday morning.

Bishops Simpson and Scott were present during the greater part of this morning's session.

Notices were given, and the Doxology sung.

The benediction was pronounced by Father Boehm.

THIRD DAY.**FRIDAY MORNING.**

Religious services by Elon J. Way.

The Minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

Question 3 of the Disciplinary questions, ("Who are admitted into full connection ?") was taken up. (*See Disciplinary Questions.*)

Hamilton C. McBride was discontinued at his own request.

Question 7, ("Who are the supernumerary Preachers ?") was taken up. (*See Disciplinary Questions.*)

James Neill was excused from the Committee on Lay Representation, and B. H. Nadal appointed in his stead.

An invitation was received from Mr. John L. Bradbury, Superintendent of the Union League House, for the members of the Conference to visit the League Rooms at their convenience. The invitation was accepted, and the Secretary directed to return the thanks of the Conference.

The hour of 10 o'clock having arrived, the Conference proceeded to elect its delegates to the next General Conference.

J. F. Meredith, W. Rink, A. Cookman and H. S. Thompson were appointed tellers.

The tellers and the Secretary were allowed to retire to count the votes.

An application for the restoration of the parchments of Henry Mains, was received from the Quarterly Conference of Lambertville charge, New-Jersey Conference. The parchments were, on motion, restored.

Question 8th, ("Who are the superannuated Preachers ?") was taken up. (*See Disciplinary Questions.*)

When the name of Wm. Quinn was called, it was announced that he had died in great peace at Newtown, Md., on the 13th of December, 1867.

The examination of effective Elders was then taken up. The Presiding Elders represented their respective districts, and their characters were passed.

The Elders reported their Missionary collections, and their characters were passed.

When the name of G. T. Barr, of South Philadelphia district, was called, the announcement was made by the Presiding Elder that he died in holy peace at Enterprise, Lancaster county, Pa., July 1st, 1867.

A paper in reference to the relief of widows and orphans of deceased members of the Conference, was presented and referred to a special committee. (*See Special Committees.*)

Documents relating to the Temperance cause were referred to the standing committee on that subject.

Rev. J. H. Vincent, agent of the Sunday School Union of the M. E. Church, was introduced, and addressed the Conference.

The annual exhibit of the Book Concern at New York, was presented and read.

On motion, it was decided to hold an afternoon session, to hear the report of the tellers, commencing at 2 o'clock,

Notices were given, and the Doxology was sung.

The benediction was pronounced by Jas. A. Massey.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION.

Religious services by Wm. H. Elliott.

The minutes of the morning session were read and approved.

The tellers reported that 246 votes had been cast for delegates to the General Conference. The President announced that J. P. Durbin, Jos. Castle, James Cunningham, W. L. Gray and G. D. Carrow, each having received a majority of votes, were duly elected delegates to the ensuing General Conference.

The Conference proceeded to vote for four additional delegates. The tellers were authorized to retire to count the votes, and report to-morrow morning.

A paper referring to the relief of families embarrassed by the death of any of our members, was presented, and on motion referred to a special committee of three.
(*See Special Committees.*)

Rev. Dr. Kynett and Rev. Dr. Wiley were introduced to the Conference.

On motion, adjourned without religious services, as the time for the Anniversary of the Sunday School Union had arrived.

ANNIVERSARY OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL UNION.

The Anniversary exercises were commenced immediately after the adjournment of the afternoon session of the Conference. The opening services were conducted by W. Kenney and Father Boehm. An address was delivered by Rev. J. H. Vincent, agent of the Sunday School Union of the M. E. Church, on "the study of the Bible, its methods and uses."

FOURTH DAY.

SATURDAY MORNING.

In the absence of the Bishop, J. F. Thompson presided.

Religious services by A. Atwood.

The minutes were read and approved.

A draft was ordered on the Treasurer of the Centenary Fund for \$474.55, to be distributed by the Board of Stewards, according to the charter.

M. D. Kurtz was elected a Trustee of the Educational Fund of the Philadelphia Conference, in place of Dr. Hodgson, whose term of service has expired.

Bishop Janes entered and occupied the chair.

In compliance with a request from the Quarterly Conference of Union Church, of this city, the parchments of Thos. Steward, a Local Deacon, were restored to him.

In compliance with a similar request from Broad Street Church, the parchments of R. Shields, a Local Deacon, were restored to him.

The tellers reported that 213 votes had been cast for the additional delegates to the General Conference.

The Bishop announced that W. McCombs was the only person who had received a majority of votes.

The Conference proceeded to ballot for three more delegates. The tellers were allowed to retire, as before.

Question 3 of the Minutes, ("Who are continued on trial?") was resumed.

Question 5. ("Who have been elected and ordained Elders this year?") was also resumed. (*See Disciplinary Questions.*)

The tellers having counted the third ballot, reported that 205 votes had been cast. The Bishop announced Robt. H. Pattison, Vaughan Smith, and Thos. C. Murphy elected they having received a majority of the votes cast. Thomas J. Thompson, S. W. Thomas and John F. Chaplain were elected reserve delegates to the General Conference.

The Bishop announced the transfer of Dr. F. Hodgson from this to the East Baltimore Conference.

Dr. Hodgson addressed the Conference in a very affectionate and feeling manner.

T. J. Thompson presented a series of resolutions, which were on motion adopted unanimously by a rising vote. (*See Resolutions.*)

At his own request Dr. Hodgson was excused from preaching the annual Missionary sermon, and his alternate, J. A. Lightbourne, requested to preach such a sermon on Monday morning, at 10 o'clock.

A Committee on Boundaries was appointed, and on motion it was ordered that all papers appertaining to boundaries be referred to said committee. (*See Special Committees.*)

On motion, Conference adjourned at 15 minutes past 12 o'clock.

Notices were given, the Doxology was sung, and the benediction was pronounced by Father Boehm.

FIFTH DAY.

MONDAY MORNING.

Dr. C. Cooke in the chair. Religious services by J. B. Quigg and Jas. A. Massey. The minutes were read and approved.

Bishop Janes in the chair.

A memorial to the General Conference was presented, asking that body to restore certain rules to the Discipline. (*See Resolutions.*)

The resolutions were voted for *seriatem*, and adopted—the vote on the first being 55 to 54. The vote on the second being 88 to 19.

W. Mullen was excused from the Committee on Finance, and Noble Frame substituted.

A communication was read announcing the decease of Chas. H. Simpson, the son of Bishop Simpson.

A committee of seven was appointed to prepare a response to the communication. (*See Special Committees.*)

The Committee on Bible Cause presented their report, which was adopted. (*See Reports.*)

The order of the day was taken up, being the preaching of the Missionary sermon. J. P. Durbin in the chair.

G. D. Carrow conducted the preliminary services.

J. H. Lightbourne announced a part of the 33d verse of the 4th chapter of the Gospel by John, and preached an able, interesting and instructive sermon.

The President announced the Committee on Boundaries. (*See Committees.*)

The Doxology was sung. Benediction by Father Boehm.

SIXTH DAY.

TUESDAY MORNING.

Religious services by T. J. Thompson.

The journal was read and approved.

Bishop Ames was requested to preside for a short time by Bishop Janes.

The report of the Freedman's Aid Society of this Conference was presented, and after some amending was adopted. (*See Reports.*)

The Preachers were directed to report collections for Freedmen's Aid Society to the Treasurer.

The committee on the question of difference between Chester Circuit and Chester Station reported that in their judgment the Conference ought to take no action in the case. The report was adopted.

The examination of effective Elders was resumed.

W. Urié's relation was changed from effective to supernumerary without appointment.

T. F. Plumer was made supernumerary with appointment.

When the name of Jno. M. Purner was called, the announcement was made that he died at Princess Anne, Md., September 29th, 1867.

Rev. H. Mattison, Secretary of the American and Foreign Christian Union, was introduced, and requested the appointment of a committee of three to confer with him with regard to the work of the Christian Union. The committee was appointed. (*See Special Committees.*)

A communication respecting uniformity in worship was presented by W. Todd, and referred to the delegates to the General Conference.

The committee on the circular from Minnesota Conference presented two reports, a majority and minority report. A substitute for both reports was offered, accepted and adopted. (*See Resolutions.*)

The time was extended.

Father Boehm being about to leave for his home, gave the Conference his parting blessing in a few touching words. He expressed very strong attachment to the Philadelphia Conference, in which he commenced his ministerial labors 67 years ago.

When Father Boehm concluded his remarks, Bishop Janes, on behalf of Mrs. Governor Cummings, presented a beautiful bouquet, accompanying the presentation with a few appropriate remarks.

Dr. Kynett, Corresponding Secretary of the Church Extension Society, addressed the Conference on behalf of the Society.

On motion, adjourned.

The Doxology was sung. The benediction was pronounced by Bishop Ames.

SEVENTH DAY.**WEDNESDAY MORNING.**

Religious services by Valentine Gray.

The journal was read and approved.

The report of the Freedmen's Aid Society was reconsidered and recommitted.

A committee on Memorial Church at Gettysburg, Pa., was appointed. (*See Special Committees.*)

The report of the Committee on Lay Representation was presented and adopted. (*See Reports.*)

The resolutions of W. Mullen and A. Wallace having been made the order of the day, were discussed, and adopted by a vote of 101 to 68.

The resolutions were referred to the delegates to the General Conference.

The Committee on American and Foreign Christian Union presented their report. (*See Reports.*)

Action on the report was postponed.

On motion, adjourned.

The Doxology was sung. The benediction was pronounced by L. C. Matlack.

EIGHTH DAY.**THURSDAY MORNING.**

C. Cooke in the chair. Religious services by L. C. Matlack.

The journal was read and approved. Bishop Janes in the chair.

The report under consideration at the time of adjournment yesterday, was taken up, and, on motion, referred to the General Conference.

The Committee on Memorial Church at Gettysburg, presented their report, which was adopted. (*See Reports.*)

The Committee on Education presented their report, which was adopted. (*See Reports.*)

B. H. Nadal addressed the Conference in reference to Drew Theological Seminary.

Gen. C. Albright addressed the Conference on behalf of the endowment of Dickinson College.

The Education collections were ordered to be paid to the Treasurer of the Education Fund, for the benefit of Dickinson College.

The report of the Stewards was read by J. B. McCullough, and the money distributed among the claimants upon the Steward's Fund.

The thanks of the Conference were tendered to the Stewards, for the faithful performance of their arduous labors.

Question 7, ("Who are the supernumeraries?") was resumed. (*See Disciplinary Questions.*)

A resolution of thanks to James A. Lightbourne was adopted. (*See Resolutions.*)

On motion, adjourned at 12.20 P. M.

The Doxology was sung. The benediction was pronounced by Dr. Jostline.

NINTH DAY.**FRIDAY MORNING.**

Bishop Janes in the chair.

Religious services by C. J. Crouch. The journal was read and approved.
The report of the officers of the Freedmen's Aid Society of this Conference, was read and adopted. (*See Reports.*)

The Committee on Temperance, the Committee on Sunday Schools, the Committee on Tract Cause, and the Committee on Church Extension presented their reports, which were read and adopted. (*See Reports.*)

The statistics were reported by the Secretary. (*See Tables.*)

J. R. Merrill, C. J. Crouch, A. Manship and H. Sanderson were each granted a supernumerary relation.

A resolution requesting J. P. Durbin, D. D., to preach a semi-centennial sermon at our next session, was adopted by a rising vote. (*See Resolutions.*)

A paper referring to the systematic work of women, in connection with the Church and Sabbath School, was presented and adopted. (*See Resolutions.*)

The subject of a Preacher's Aid Society was referred to a special committee, to report at our next session. (*See Committees.*)

The report of the Trustees of Mt. Moriah Conference lot, was accepted and filed.

The report of the special committee on change of rule in the Discipline, was presented, and referred to the General Conference.

A paper on the use of tobacco was presented, and, after amendment, was adopted. [*See Resolutions.*]

Resolutions referring to the M. E. Church at Greensboro, were adopted; also, resolutions relating to the Pennsylvania Seamen's Aid Society. [*See Resolutions.*]

The following was offered, and referred to the delegates to the General Conference, viz. :

Resolution: That the general Rule on Temperance be amended by striking out the word "spirituous" and inserting "intoxicating." And, also, by inserting after the word "liquors" the words "or encouraging their sale": so as to read, "Buying or selling intoxicating liquors, or encouraging their sale, or drinking them except in cases of extreme necessity."

The Committee on Boundaries presented a majority and a minority report.

The majority report was, on motion, adopted. [*See Reports.*]

A resolution referring to the visitation of prisons, alms-houses, school houses, and orphanages, was adopted. [*See Resolutions.*]

The papers relating to the boundaries were referred to the delegates to General Conference.

The report of the Committee on Finance was accepted and filed, and money directed as follows:

For the Bible Cause, to I. H. Torrence.

For S. S. Union, to Carlton & Porter.

For Church Extension, to Jas. Long.

For General Conference, to Jos. Castle, Chairman of the delegation.

The time of the morning session was extended.

A collection for the relief of Brother Sanderson was taken up, amounting to \$400.01.

Wilmington, Del., was fixed as the seat of the next Conference.

The General Conference was requested to allow both bodies to meet together next year, in case of a division of the Conference.

A collection was taken for the sexton, amounting to \$90.00.

Question 1st, "Who are admitted on trial?"—was taken up. [See disciplinary questions.]

The memoirs of G. T. Barr, Wm. Quinn, and John M. Purner, were read and adopted. [See memoirs.]

A resolution relating to the Conference Albums was adopted. [See resolutions.]

The Bishop announced the usual committees of examination and visitation. [See committees.]

A paper relating to our Churches in Virginia was presented and adopted. [See resolutions.]

The Committee on Missions presented their report, which was filed. [See Reports.]

Resolutions of thanks were read and adopted. [See Resolutions.]

C. F. Turner was elected Vice-President of the Sunday-School Union.

The Trustees of the Mt. Moriah Conference lot were re-elected.

The journal was read and approved.

Bishop Janes read St. Matthew, 28th chapter, from the 16th verse to the end of the chapter; Hymn 712 was sung; the Bishop offered prayer: after which he made a short address.

The 17th question. ["Where are the Preachers stationed this year?"] was then taken up. [See Appointments.]

On motion, the Conference adjourned *sine die*, having been in session this day, without intermission, seven hours.

The Benediction was pronounced by Bishop Janes.

MEMOIRS.

REV. GIDEON T. BARR.

This young minister was born near Quarryville, Lancaster Co., Pa., December 4, 1832, and departed this life July 1, 1867, in Enterprise, in the same County. Like his Divine master he was thus cut off in the prime of manhood, in his thirty-fifth year.

When about ten years old he was deeply convinced of the importance of a change of heart, by reading an account of the life and happy death of a Sunday School scholar. He wept, and prayed that God would make him good. In after-life he believed that he was then converted; but he did not speak of the change, and these impressions faded away.

His mother, a Christian woman, and a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, died when he was about twelve years of age. He never forgot her instructions and prayers; and under God they led him to seek the favor of the Lord in his seventeenth year.

A few months before his death he gave an account of his conversion; so far as his wife could remember, in these words: "I had been seeking the pardon of my sins for some time, and had prayed earnestly sometimes in the fields, and in the barn, and my own room. I told no one of my convictions. I thought I could obtain and enjoy religion all to myself. I became more wretched, and resolved one Sabbath to attend a class-meeting which met in a school-house near my home. On the way I met some of my companions. They asked where I was going. I told them I was going to meeting, and that I intended to lead a new life, and determined to be a Christian. They told me I was too late: meeting would be out before I got there. I went home, and the next Sabbath started again earlier than before, and went around another way to avoid them. I went into that little meeting with a hardened heart. The leader, a good old man, who had been my mother's leader, said to me, after class, 'I knew what brought you here as soon as you entered the door.' I arose to speak, and told them how I had been seeking the Lord, and how burdened and wretched I felt; when, thank God! the burden was rolled off and I was a new creature."

After his conversion he was very studious, and used all available helps toward mental improvement. He joined the Church at the Mt. Hope appointment.

During the autumn of 1855 he taught school at Hempfield, and spent his Sabbaths in Lancaster. On the 16th of November he preached his first sermon. Rev. L. Bartine, the pastor, had announced preaching in the lecture-room on Friday night. "But lo!" said brother Barr, "when the night came the sexton lit the audience-room. I told Mr. Bartine I could not preach there. He stepped out of the study and in a short time returned and said, 'Gid, it has been spread abroad somehow that you are to preach, and I guess you had better do so.' The time came, and he and I went up, and how I felt you can imagine. There was a large congregation. Well, I began. I had a good man by my side and the blessed arm of the Lord around me."

On the 24th of November he was licensed to preach by the Duke Street Quarterly Conference, without a dissenting voice. In the spring of 1856 he was received on trial in the Philadelphia Conference, and appointed, with Rev. H. B. Mauger, to Halifax circuit. The next year they were both appointed to Radnor. In 1858 he was in charge of Hummelstown circuit. The next year he was re-appointed. On the 18th of May, 1859, he was married to Miss Kate R. Binkley. In 1860-1 his appointment was Perryville; '62-3, Tremont; '64-5, St. Clair; '66, Allentown. He labored hard through this Centenary year, and was often much

exhausted after Sabbath work. In February, 1867, he took cold while in the discharge of his ministerial duties, but was so far restored as to attend the session of the Conference. During the session he grew worse, and many may remember his emaciated appearance at that time.

Had only ordinary zeal in the cause of God animated this devoted spirit, he would probably have desisted from the work of the ministry at that time, and given chief attention to the restoration of his feeble health; but so indomitable was his will, so cheerful and hopeful a view did he take of his case, and so ardent was his love for the holy calling to which Christ and the Church had summoned him, that he continued on the effective list, and received an appointment to Dauphin Circuit.

For nearly three months he continued to preach on this his last field of labor. His physical weakness was extreme. So death-like was his appearance that he attracted the attention of all who saw him.

About the first of June he went, accompanied by his family, to the house of his father-in-law, hoping to find relief; but he gradually grew weaker until he passed triumphantly home to his Father's house in heaven.

The death-scene was very bright. He asked the time of day. His wife replied, "two o'clock." "Ah," said he, with such peculiar significance as to indicate that he knew when he would depart. His sister-in-law was standing at the foot of the bed, weeping. He said, "Annie, where is your trust now?" He said to his mother-in-law, "Ma, you thought I was dying this morning." "Yes," she said, "we were afraid you were going to leave us." He replied, "I knew I was not dying then." His wife asked, "Do you know you are dying now?" "Yes," he replied; and then gave her into the hands of the Saviour.

The doctor coming in, he said, with a great deal of emphasis, "Doctor, I'll show you how a Christian can die." His little daughter went up close to the bed. Her grandmother said, "Here's Adele, papa." Looking at his dear child, he finished his sublime antithesis,—"Adele, darling, shall show you how a Christian can live."

Some Christian friends were singing. He said, "Can't we have a shout? If I had strength I'd praise the Lord." Almost his last words were, "Hallelujah! Hallelujah!"

Adele said, "Have the angels come for papa?" He looked and smiled.

He had often spoken of the pains of dying. He anticipated a severe struggle; but he was very free from pain, and passed away so calmly and gently that the moment of death could hardly be determined.

In his study-bible are many passages marked. Among them is Jer. 13: 16. "Give glory to the Lord your God, before he cause darkness, and before your feet stumble upon the dark mountains, and, while ye look for light, he turn it into the shadow of death, and make it gross darkness." On the margin he wrote, "It is not 'gross darkness' for the Christian, but simply a shadow." So he found it.

Our departed brother was pleasing and attractive in address; neat and engaging in personal appearance; cheerful and buoyant in spirits; genial and affable in conversation; studious and thoughtful in his mental habits; careful and thorough in his pulpit preparations; effective and superior in his pulpit ministrations.

He was laying the foundation for what would have claimed for him, under God, exalted and commanding position among his brethren. In the preparation-state of that ministry which he did fulfill he showed himself a workman that needed not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth, and through his instrumentality much people were added unto the Lord, and the Church of God was edified and established.

REV. JOHN MILTON PURNER.

Rev. John Milton Purner was born at Brick-Meeting-House, Cecil county, Maryland, March 31, 1833, and died at Princess Anne, Somerset county, Maryland, on Sunday morning, September 29th, 1867, in the 35th year of his age, and the 10th year of his itinerant ministry.

Brother Purner was "born again" at Elkton, Md., in January, 1854, under the ministry of Rev. Elon J. Way, and, it is believed, he never lost the evidence of his acceptance with God.

In 1856 he removed to Oxford, Pa., where he did business until he entered the itinerancy; and where he was known as a man of sterling Christian integrity.

In 1857 he was appointed a class-leader; and in 1858 he was licensed to exhort by Rev. T. B. Miller, then the preacher in charge on Oxford Circuit.

Soon after Conference, in 1858, Brother Purner was appointed assistant preacher to Rev. H. Sanderson, on Lewistown Circuit, by Rev. Henry Colclazer, then Presiding Elder on Snow Hill District; and, at a camp-meeting held on the Circuit that year, his doubts as to his call to the ministry were all removed; and in 1859 he, with twenty-seven other brethren, was admitted on probation in the Philadelphia Annual Conference, of which he continued a useful and worthy member until his departure to "the saints' everlasting rest."

Brother Purner was Junior Preacher on Laurel circuit, Delaware, in 1859, and on Church Creek circuit, Md., in 1860. In 1861 and 1862 he was in charge on Aries circuit, Md. In 1863 and 1864 he was in charge on Sharptown circuit, Md., and in 1865 was nominally appointed Junior Preacher on Princess Anne circuit, Md., to permit him to go to the Biblical Institute, Concord, New Hampshire. In 1866 he was in charge of Atlantic circuit, Va., and in 1867 he was in charge of Accomac circuit for a short time, whence he was removed by the Presiding Elder, Rev. V. Smith, and appointed in charge of Princess Anne Circuit, Md., where he closed his labor and his life, after a few weeks of severe affliction, borne with patience and resignation to the will of his Heavenly Father.

At his own request, his remains were taken to the Brick-Meeting-House, his native place, and there interred in the cemetery, on Tuesday, October 1st, 1867, with appropriate funeral services, there to rest in hope of the general resurrection and eternal life.

Brother Purner was exemplary in all the relations of life. As a Christian, he was a good man, full of faith and the Holy Ghost. As a Methodist preacher, he was plain, practical, earnest and faithful; and an earnest and constant worker in the vineyard of the Lord. Several church edifices were erected through his zeal and indomitable energy; and many souls were added to the Lord through his instrumentality; who will be stars in the crown of his rejoicing in the day of the Lord.

Appointed to labor in that part of the field where to be loyal to the country and to Methodism costs something, he was ever truly faithful to his country, his Church and his God, under the most trying circumstances. He was not "carried to the skies on flowery beds of ease." The tribulations through which he passed no doubt shortened his life. He was in fact a martyr in the cause of his country and his Church. Eternity alone will reveal the suffering he and his family endured from the enemies of the country and of the Methodist Episcopal Church. Through much tribulation he has entered the kingdom of heaven.

During the last year or two of his life he enjoyed; and delighted to lead others into the enjoyment of that perfect love which casteth out all fear; and when death came he was ready to depart. The salvation he had preached to others he enjoyed in his own soul. To his weeping family he said, "I am healed, soul and body." To his brethren in the ministry he sends this last message: "Tell my brethren I died at my post."

O may we triumph so,
When all our warfare's past;
And, dying, find our latest foe
Under our feet at last!

REV. WILLIAM QUINN.

Rev. William Quinn was born June 20th, 1790, and died at his residence near Newtown, Md., December 13th, 1867, in the 78th year of his age.

His conversion occurred about his 16th year. Three or four years afterwards he commenced to preach the unsearchable riches of the gospel, and was in 1817 admitted on trial into the Philadelphia Conference. From this time, with all the ardor of his nature he went forth upon his high mission, laboring in whatever field was assigned him. Frequently, during this period, the Lord was pleased in a marvelous manner to own and bless his ministry with the gathering of hundreds of immortal souls. There are, doubtless, many of these, having passed on before him, who, on the bleak December day he left us, welcomed him with joy into the presence of his Lord, and now call him "blessed."

His various fields of labor, as indicated in the Conference Minutes, were: Talbot Circuit, 1817; Caroline, 1818; Dauphin, 1819; Lewiston, 1820; Dorchester, 1821-2; Acomac, 1823-4; and Annemessex, 1825. He then took a supernumerary relation until 1838, when, entering again the active work, he served the church on Salisbury Circuit, 1839-40; Kent, 1841-2; Milford, 1843-4; and Berlin, 1845.

Declining health then admonished him to take a more quiet relation. Though sundering the ties which knit him to the itinerancy, his subsequent life at Newtown was no exception to the zeal for God which had characterized his earlier days. With the burden of years coming upon him, he continued to labor for his Saviour. In every good word and work he was foremost. His genial face and venerable form could be seen in almost every assembly, when God was to be honored, or the community blessed, and though he had been for nearly sixty years laboring for his God, yet the last Sabbath of his life found him amid the devotions of the sanctuary, and those who heard his voice in prayer that day will not soon forget the holy trust he manifested, or the anxiety he expressed for the welfare of Zion.

It pleased the Lord to spare his servant the weariness of a protracted sickness. Only a few days had passed in pain, when at once he closed his labors and his life. The few weeks previous to his decease seemed to be marked by vague foreshadowings of the coming event. It was noticed that his prayers at the family altar had deepened in strength and increased in spirituality, as if there had come to his soul an earnest of the worship of the upper world. As death drew near, his testimony was clear as to his acceptance with God. To the Rev. Dr. Murray, who visited him, he said, "The God who blessed my youth, will not, I know, forsake me in my old age." Once, during a painful operation which was being performed upon him, he checked himself when he would have groaned, and said, "No, I can endure much more than this, if it be necessary, to glorify Jesus Christ." Those words tell the story of his victory over the ills of this mortal state.

The traits of his character were strongly marked. As a Christian, his faith was habit, and his love for Christians was too pure and lofty to be weakened or alienated by local differences. Truly he exemplified charity by the tender interest he manifested in all with whom he had association.

If he was impulsive, he was liberal and magnanimous, and readily forgave all injuries inflicted upon him. A spirit of self-sacrifice marked his intercourse with men, and made him the friend and assistant of all. Crowning the rest, however, was the serenity and hopefulness of his temperament, which raised him above gloom and discontent. He had a warm, young heart, out of which came affection as buoyant and noble in his age as in his earlier days. The strength of his intellect was most clearly demonstrated in his writings and pulpit ministrations. He had a thorough and profound knowledge of theology, and taught its great doctrinal points with clearness and unction. He was an untiring student to the close of his days, and has left behind expositions of Scripture which would enrich any library.

In his family relations he was an affectionate husband and father, and the weight of years rather sanctified than weakened the bonds that allied him to his loved

ones. Indeed, everywhere and in all relations, he gave evidence that "the grace of God had not been bestowed in vain." It sustained him amid the varied experiences of a long life; it threw lustre about his closing hours, and it has added another veteran to the noble army of heroes in the kingdom of glory.

He will be missed in the community, in the church, and, most of all, in the hearts that made up the joy of his home; and many a sad thought will turn to the hour when, amid the silent fall of the snow, he was laid away in the little grave-yard in the field. Yes, he will be missed, but "he rests from his labors, and his works do follow him." To the living, and not to the pious dead, does death seem stern, and the grave have terrors.

May the virtue and fidelity of his life, glorified by his triumphant exit, give light to many a spirit searching after the true God. May his death be an eloquent tongue, pleading the claims of the Master to whom he has gone.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF STEWARDS,

FOR THE YEAR ENDING MARCH, 1868.

The return of another session of our Annual Conference has brought to the Board of Stewards a renewal of their responsibilities and duties in relation to the funds placed at their disposal for the benefit of our worthy Conference claimants. These responsibilities they have endeavored to meet to the best of their ability, and they herewith present to the Conference, and to the Church as represented by them, the following as the result of their labors:

The total amount placed in their hands for distribution the present year is nine thousand nine hundred and sixteen dollars and one cent (\$9,916.01), an advance on the aggregate of last year's report of one hundred and twenty-five dollars and forty-three cents (\$125.43). After deducting the proceeds of the Centenary and chartered funds, and some special donations received last year, we have an actual advance in the collections in the several charges of two hundred and fifty-three dollars (\$253). This, taking all things into consideration, is a most gratifying result, and shows that this collection has an abiding place in the affections of the people.

The number of claimants admitted by the Board is sixty-five, or one less than last year. These include six superannuated ministers, ten supernumeraries, forty-two widows, and two children of deceased ministers, and five men in the effective work, whose necessities are such as in the opinion of the Board justify them in becoming temporary beneficiaries of this fund.

Several other claims were presented to the Board, that were entirely disallowed, not because the brethren presenting them were not needy, but because in some instances they had already received more than many of their brethren who have made no claim, and in other cases were young men who would be injured in their future standing in the Conference by becoming claimants upon this fund, while the admission of their claim would greatly injure the collections in the future, and so far injure also the persons for whom these collections are especially taken.

The aggregate claim of those admitted to our lists the present year is sixteen thousand four hundred and five dollars (\$16,405), an advance of three hundred and five dollars (\$305) on the claim made a year since.

The claims presented by many Quarterly Conference Committees are unduly large—much larger indeed than they expect to be awarded; but they hope by making them so high to receive more than they would otherwise be likely to receive. But this is a great mistake, and, in the estimation of the Board, often injures rather than improves the case of the claimant. What the Board desires is not only a just estimate of the wants of the claimant, but also the substantial reasons or facts on which the claim is based.

The distribution made by the Stewards of the funds on hand we can hardly hope will give satisfaction either to the claimants themselves or to their respective friends, as each is apt to think his case more pressing than that of any other. But, perhaps, if all could take a general survey of the whole field, as the Board have done, they would be satisfied that the distribution made is as just and equitable as is possible under the circumstances.

The assessments for the coming year will be found to remain substantially as they were last year, except in a few instances, where they were manifestly too high or too low. The aggregate assessed is ten thousand one hundred and ninety

dollars (\$10,190), or an advance on last year's assessment of two hundred and sixty dollars (\$260). These assessments are made wholly on the ground of the ability, real and relative, of the different charges, this being the only basis on which an equitable assessment can be made. In regard to this ability, the Board may sometimes err, for want of adequate information; but representing, as they do, every part of our Conference territory, and having before them a comprehensive view of the whole field, it must be admitted that they have facilities for arriving at just conclusions in regard to the matter, such as can be possessed by no outside parties, however well informed in other respects.

Hoping, therefore, that the brethren, both of the ministry and the laity, acquiescing as far as possible in the judgment of the Board, and regarding their assessments as they were intended, not as a tax to be collected under penalty, but as the decisions of an intelligent Committee, will take their respective amounts, and, without reference to any other charge, endeavor to raise them fully, they commit the whole matter to the Church, assuring them that, could they know all that the Stewards know of the destitution and want of many of our Conference claimants, they would send up cheerfully next year double the amount indicated in the assessment.

With these statements and suggestions the Board would respectfully submit for adoption by the Conference the following resolutions:

Resolved, 1. That we recommend the collections for our necessitous Conference claimants as one having the strongest claims upon the sympathy and benevolence of our people, and that we will use our utmost efforts to raise the amounts appropriated to our respective charges.

Resolved, 2. That preachers in charge of circuits and stations shall be required to report their collections for Conference claimants on the second day of the next session of the Conference, stating at the time both the amount apportioned and the amount collected; said collections to be in checks or in United States notes, of as large a denomination as possible.

Resolved, 3. That, inasmuch as it is important to the Board of Stewards that they be notified at an early period in the session of all the claims likely to come before them, it shall be the duty of all recognized Conference claimants, as well as of those about to change their relation and needing assistance, to give notice of the fact in writing, or through their Presiding Elder, on the second day of the next session, immediately after the call of the Stewards shall have been made.

Resolved, 4. That it is still the sense of this Conference, that, in the distribution of the work from time to time, no appointments should be made that do not promise to be self-sustaining at an early period; and that, where it is found necessary to keep up those that are otherwise, the proper authorities should see that suitable provision be made to assist in the support of said appointments out of the Missionary funds of the Church, rather than from those placed in the hands of the Stewards for the special benefit of necessitous claimants.

Resolved, 5. That the collection for Conference claimants, whenever practicable, shall be taken up in the months of October and November.

The Conference and the friends of the Tract enterprise certainly have abundant cause for congratulation, and of profound gratitude to God, in view of the wonderful success which has attended this work; and we recommend the adoption of the following resolutions:

- That we recognize the importance of Tract distribution, on the part of Pastors and others, as a means of reaching many who are not brought under the power of the preached word, and as a help towards the salvation of souls.
 - That we earnestly recommend the hearty co-operation of all our Ministers and members in the work of Tract distribution, according to plans proposed by our Conference Corresponding Secretary.
 - That a Tract collection be taken in all our charges, and that we will endeavor as far as we can to make it liberal.
 - That the thanks of the Conference are due, and are hereby extended to Rev. S. W. Thomas, the Corresponding Secretary, for the efficient manner in which he has discharged the duties of his office: resulting, as it has done by the co-operation of his fellow-laborers in the work, in the splendid financial exhibit herewith presented, and in such advancement of the cause of God as only He can appreciate.
 - That we hereby extend our thanks to the Board of Managers and Executive Committee for the faithful and efficient manner in which they have managed the trust confided to them.
 - That we heartily commend the course pursued by the Board of Managers and the Corresponding Secretary, in keeping separate and distinct accounts of the benevolent and the business operations of the Society, and in charging a due proportion of the expenses of the Tract Agency to the Depository.

7. That as the Methodist Book Room, at 1018 Arch street, Philadelphia, is purely a church property, and its business is transacted only for the interest of the church, we hereby command it to the confiding patronage of our members and friends.

8. That we recommend the re-appointment of Rev. S. W. Thomas as Corresponding Secretary of the Philadelphia Conference Tract Society.

9. That as Philadelphia, the second city in the country in point of population, and the original seat of the book interests of our denomination, ought to have a share in the general interests of the church; and as the Philadelphia Conference Tract Society has manifested vitality such as has characterized no other Conference organization—and as we have now a Tract Depository in this city, which would be a fit place for the management of a general church interest—and as we believe that it would decidedly promote the efficiency of the Tract Cause to have it separated from the book department at New York—we hereby express it as our decided conviction that Philadelphia ought to be the centre of the Tract interests of the Church, and that we hereby instruct our delegates to the General Conference to use their utmost efforts to secure this result.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

The Committee on Sabbath Schools beg leave to report: That the increasing attention of the Church to this cause, the wide-spread conviction of its surpassing importance, the multiplying facilities for its permanent efficiency and continued progress, and the abounding prosperity which on every hand has attended careful and earnest efforts in this field, call for grateful songs of joy and devout thanksgivings.

We propose the following resolutions:

1. Resolved, That we recommend all the members of Conference, whether they labor on circuits or in stations, to avail themselves of all the improved appliances for Sabbath School instruction, in books, maps, &c., offered by our publishers, and that they take measures for holding Normal Classes, Institutes, or Teachers' Meetings in all their Schools.

2. Resolved, That we request the Presiding Elders and the Conference Sunday school Committee to arrange for holding a Sabbath School Convention, if possible, in each of the districts.

3. Resolved, That, in view of the exceeding value of forming the habit of sobriety early in life, we commend the Temperance cause to a prominent place in the Sabbath School, and urge that a patient and earnest endeavor be made to enrol all the children in the total abstinence army.

4. Resolved, That, inasmuch as the Pastor is the guide and head of the Sabbath School under his charge, it is highly important that he should be thoroughly furnished for this work, we therefore hereby instruct our Delegates to the General Conference to request the incorporation, in the course of ministerial study, of a department relating to Sabbath School instruction.

5. Resolved, That in our judgment, wherever it is possible, the sessions of the Sabbath School should be so arranged that the children called together for the School should be enabled to attend also the public worship of Almighty God with the adult congregation.

6. Resolved, That we recommend the disciplinary rule requiring the Sabbath School to be organized as a Juvenile Missionary Society be carefully observed in every place.

7. Resolved, That the Conference Vice-President of the Sunday School Union and the District Committee to be appointed are hereby instructed to make arrangements for holding a Sunday School Anniversary on the second evening of Session of 1869.

8. Resolved, That we cordially approve of the Normal College recently organized by the Sunday School Union at New York, and commend it to the attention of all our co-laborers in the Sabbath School work.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION.

The Committee on Education beg leave to report:

That the institutions of learning which share the sympathy and patronage of Conference are realizing such a measure of prosperity as calls for unfeigned thanksgiving to Almighty God, the Father of mercies and Fountain of all true success. These institutions are, Dickinson College, Carlisle, Pa.; Dickinson Seminary, Williamsport, Pa.; West River Classical Institute, West River, Md.; Irving Female College, Mechanicsburg, Pa., and the Wesleyan Female College, Wilmington, Del. Two of the above named institutions have long claimed the intense interest of this Conference, and it is highly gratifying to know that our efforts have not been in vain, as their present condition amply proves. The official report of the Trustees of Dickinson College, made through the President of the College, Rev. H. M. Johnson, D.D., shows that the total productive endowment fund of the College is now \$148,814.51, with some prospect of obtaining an additional sum of \$10,000.

Whilst we rejoice in the attainment of this noble result after so much anxious effort, we deem the present a fitting occasion to impress earnestly upon the mind of the Conference and Church that the enlightened spirit of the age in which we live, the future populousness and power of the country, and the Providential relation of Methodism to the Republic and the world, all imperatively call upon us to aim at the speedy establishment of a first-class University, one which will equal in literary merit, and surpass in fervent evangelism, the Universities of England, and of the Continent of Europe. We have faith in God and in the intrinsic goodness of the cause of Christian Education to believe that, if we will it to be so, Dickinson College shall yet expand into such stateliness of proportion, and flower into such perfection of beauty, as we have just indicated. Let the subject of a noble University, with well-endowed Literary, Theological and Law Departments, be kept constantly before the attention of the Church as a sublime result—charged with human destinies—to be realized in the not remote future. Let unceasing argument and prayer be employed to the end that God may so touch the hearts of our people that many of them favored with wealth will joyfully rally to this great work of building up a University in which the young men of coming generations will acquire a comprehensive, solid, polished, Christian Education, and thus lay great bases for usefulness in time, and vast fruitions in eternity.

Your Committee would also direct the distinct notice of the Conference and Church to the Wesleyan Female College, Wilmington, Del., an institution which has sent forth into society very many cultivated Christian women, whose refining and elevating influence in the earth will only be known in the life to come. The financial condition of the College is encouraging, though it is a matter of sincere regret that the Centenary effort in its behalf did not realize more than about \$2000. There are two vacancies in the Board of Trustees, for which we nominated Rev. David R. Thomas, and Rev. J. D. Curtis.

The Drew Theological Seminary, established and endowed by the munificent Centenary offering of Daniel Drew, Esq., of New York, and located at Madison, New Jersey, was brought to the favorable notice of your Committee by the Rev. B. H. Nadal, D.D., one of the Professors in the Seminary. We doubt not that, under the guidance and blessing of God, the newly organized Seminary will wield a healthy influence in the Church.

The report of the Treasurer of the Education Fund of the Philadelphia Annual Conference,—John Whiteman, Esq.,—is herewith submitted to the Conference. (1)

Your Committee would recommend the adoption by the Conference of the following resolutions, viz.:

Resolved, I. That the Philadelphia Annual Conference reaffirms its unabated interest in all the Literary institutions under its patronage, especially in Dickinson College, Carlisle, Pa., and the Wesleyan Female College, Wilmington, Del., institutions for whose success the faith of the Conference is solemnly pledged.

II. That we recommend to the Conference that additional efforts be put forth

to increase the endowment fund of Dickinson College, so that the present Faculty may be better compensated, and the services of additional Professors may be secured.

III. That the Presiding Elders be requested to inquire at the first Quarterly Conference succeeding the present session of the Annual Conference, if there be in any of the charges of their several Districts any uncollected Centenary subscriptions for the Literary Institutions under our care, and if there be any such subscriptions, that they instruct the Preacher in charge to collect them immediately and forward them to James Long, Esq., Treasurer of the Centenary Fund, No. 203 Church St., Philadelphia, and the Presiding elders be requested to report the state of the case immediately to the Secretary of the Centenary Fund.

IV. That we urge upon the attention of all our churches the importance of aiding young men called of God to the work of the ministry in their efforts to acquire a thorough Christian Education.

V. That, approving as we do of the Biblical Department in Dickinson College, we also commend to candidates for the ministry whose time and means will admit of a more extended Theological Curriculum, the Drew Theological Seminary, as an institution in all respects worthy of their patronage.

VI. That we urgently recommend our churches to observe the Annual Concert of Prayer for Colleges, on the last Thursday of February in each year.

VII. That the usual visiting committees to the several institutions named in this report be appointed by the Chair.

Your Committee, in closing their report, beg leave to nominate, for election by the Conference, the following named lay brethren, to serve on the next Annual Education Committee, viz.:

REPORT OF THE FREEDMEN'S AID SOCIETY.

The Officers of the Freedmen's Aid Society having reconsidered their former statements, and new facts having come to their notice, offer the following as their report:

They do not find a sufficient interest in the subject to justify, in their judgment, the continuation of a distinct organization, but judge from the interest they have perceived that the cause of the Education of the Freedmen of this country should not be ignored. We trust that, though the question of taking up collections in aid of the cause may be left to the preachers to determine in their several charges, many will take them up, and thus aid those with whom freedom is an empty name without the ability to use it to advantage.

We find, from the best information we can gather, that the contributions within the Conference during the year have been as follows:

We recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That Mr. Joseph A. Thornley, of this city, be and is hereby constituted Treasurer of any funds collected in this Conference for "The Freedmen's Aid Society of the M. E. Church," and that he pay to the order of the Treasurer of said Society all moneys that are now, and may come into his hands at any future time, and report to this Conference at its next Annual Session.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE BIBLE CAUSE.

The Committee on the Bible Cause present the following as their report:

Regarding the Holy Scriptures as the only authoritative rule of faith and practice, as fundamental alike to national and private virtue, and therefore their circulation as necessary to the stability of civil governments, the peace of society, and the salvation of the lost; we hail with grateful pleasure the intelligence that the American Bible Society is doing its work with untiring diligence. As that noble Society is a great fountain, sending forth innumerable streams to irrigate the most sterile parts of the world, but must itself be fed by the munificence of God's stewards, that "the wilderness and solitary places may be glad for them, and the deserts rejoice and blossom as the rose," Therefore

1. Resolved, That we have unabating confidence in the working and efficacy of this great agency for good.

2. Resolved, That as faith without works is dead, so will be our confidence if we do not labor to hold up its hands in the great work of translating, printing and circulating the blessed Word of God.

3. Resolved, That we will give accredited agents access to our pulpits, and, in failing to enjoy their visits, will take a collection for the Bible cause in all our churches once a year, and urge our congregations to evince a liberality commensurate with the importance of the work, and creditable to their religious professions.

4. Resolved, That, as local societies, like the parent society itself, are composed of Christians of different denominations, we advise their liberal support in a true catholic spirit; and that the sums contributed by our own members be reported to Conference as parts of the Bible collections in the circuits and stations respectively.

5. Resolved, That, as it is found by experience that the most effectual way of distributing the Holy Scriptures is by means of local or auxiliary Bible societies, that we will co-operate with, encourage and strengthen the auxiliary societies, where any exist, and, as far as practicable, assist in the organization of such where there are none.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON BOUNDARIES.

The Committee on Boundaries respectfully submit:

That, after careful consideration, we have concluded that a division of our Conference, by State lines, will be the most satisfactory and advantageous. We have, therefore, agreed to submit the following resolutions for the consideration of the Conference:

Resolved, 1. That we, the Philadelphia Annual Conference, recommend the ensuing General Conference to divide the Philadelphia Annual Conference by the State line separating Delaware and Maryland from Pennsylvania: and thus constituting a new Conference of the State of Delaware and the "Eastern Slopes" of Maryland and Virginia, to be called the "Wilmington Annual Conference."

Resolved, 2. That we recommend that our northern boundaries be by the northern lines of the counties of Monroe, Carbon, Schuylkill and Dauphin.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CHURCH EXTENSION.

The committee to whom was referred all matters relating to the subject of church extension, after due consideration, beg leave to report, for the adoption of the Conference, the following resolutions:

1. That the fact should be constantly kept in view that the one grand design of

the Parent Church Extension Society and its Conference auxiliaries, is to build up churches, and relieve from debt churches already built, in *destitute* communities.

2. That destitute communities are hereby reminded of the aforesaid design, and recommended to look to these organizations for aid, rather than to agents employed to travel and make personal solicitations.

3. That while applications from the destitute abroad should be made to the Church Extension Society, it is not the design of that Society to discourage, still less to prevent, applications to individuals, residing within the bounds of those Conferences, where God has blest the church with abundance, in behalf of churches erected, or to be erected, within the limits of said Conferences.

4. That the necessities of the work in our own Conference require the appropriation of *Fifty* per cent, of the Conference funds, and, that in our judgment, the expenditure of this proportion of the whole sum contributed, will be to the advantage of the Treasury of the parent Board.

5. That the sum which the parent Board have requested this Conference to raise, during the present year, be distributed among the several charges, as nearly as may be possible in accordance with the ability of each.

6. That by the blessing of Almighty God we will, especially in view of the extreme necessity of aid in the South and the far West, endeavor to realize the expectations of the parent Board.

MEMORIAL CHURCH AT GETTYSBURG.

The committee to whom was referred the subject of a memorial church at Gettysburg, beg leave to report the following, viz:

Whereas, The East Baltimore Conference have appointed the Rev. John B. Mann, their agent to raise funds to build a memorial church at Gettysburg and pledge his support for the year. And whereas, A Methodist church is greatly needed at that place, the building of which would be a proper monument to the memory of the men who have fallen on the field of battle at that place in defence of the Government,

Therefore, Resolved, 1st., That we cordially unite with the East Baltimore Conference in commanding the subject of a memorial church at Gettysburg to all the friends and members of our church.

Resolved, 2d., That we do this on the ground of the need of such a church to Methodism in that place, and because of our respect for the memory of the thousands of our fellow citizens who gave up their lives on that bloody field for the defence of our Government.

RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED.

RESOLUTIONS REFERRED TO THE GENERAL CONFERENCE.

Resolved, That the general Rule on Temperance be amended by striking out the word "spirituous" and inserting "intoxicating." And, also, by inserting after the word "liquors" the words "or encouraging their sale": so as to read, "Buying or selling intoxicating liquors, or encouraging their sale, or drinking them except in cases of extreme necessity."

Resolved. That we hereby constitute ourselves a committee of the whole, for the coming year, to visit the almshouses, jails, orphanages, public schools and other charitable and public institutions in the neighborhood of our respective charges, at least quarterly, that we may work more systematically for the promotion of the Redeemer's cause among them.

Whereas, The Methodist Episcopal Church has occupied from the beginning an unequivocal position on the question of Temperance, and has incorporated in its Book of Discipline a strict rule on the subject, it is becoming in us to keep our views before the people in order to inspire them with zeal and call forth renewed efforts for the overthrow of the traffic in intoxicating drinks. Therefore,

Resolved, 1. That, in the judgment of this Conference, the appetite for intoxicating drinks is frequently transmitted by inheritance from one generation to another, and is often acquired by the indiscriminate administration of alcoholic remedies in infancy and youth.

Resolved, 2. That it is easier to prevent the formation of an appetite than successfully to prohibit its indulgence when once formed.

Resolved, 3. That regarding this desire for alcoholic stimulation as an unnatural and hence a morbid appetite, it is the dictate of wisdom to treat it as far as possible as a disease, and hence we believe that the establishment of homes, asylums or hospitals for the recovery of inebriates is a demand of the enlightened civilization and Christianity of the present day.

Resolved, 4. That the introduction of wines and other intoxicating drinks into social parties is giving countenance to that which results in intemperate habits, and is in direct violation of our Book of Discipline.

Resolved, 5. That the use of popular medicines of which alcohol is the principal ingredient is a prolific source of intemperance, and we condemn their use and the practice of endorsing them by our ministers and people.

Resolved, 6. That total abstinence from the use of intoxicating drinks as a beverage is the only safe and Scriptural ground for Christian people to occupy.

Resolved, 7. That we will endeavor, by preaching and otherwise, to promote habits of Temperance among our people and the communities where we labor.

Resolved, 8. That the Officers and Teachers of our Sunday Schools are requested to impress upon our children the necessity of pledging themselves to total abstinence, and we will co-operate in that work,

Resolved, 9. That we recommend the forming of open Temperance Societies in co-operation with existing organizations.

Resolved 10. That we endorse and encourage the organization and work of the various Temperance Societies outside of the Church.

Resolved, 11. That it is in our judgment right that our churches should be open for the holding of proper public Temperance meetings, provided the sanctity of the place is always observed.

Resolved, 12. That we hail with pleasure the publication of Temperance peri-

odicals and newspapers, and the more frequent introduction of the subject into our Church Literature.

Resolved, 13, That, as our brother Rev. P. Coombe has been offered the position of Secretary for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania by Pennsylvania State Temperance Union, and has signified his willingness to accept, we therefore request the Presiding Bishop to appoint him to that work, and we will welcome him to our pulpits to preach on the subject.

LAY DELEGATION.

The committee to whom was referred a communication from certain laymen of New York and elsewhere, on the subject of lay representation, having given attention to the subject, respectfully recommend the adoption of the following resolution :

Resolved, That we favor the introduction of lay delegation into the General Conference whenever that body shall be fully satisfied that a majority of our laity desire it. And should the General Conference, at its approaching session, be in doubt as to the mind of the church, then, in that case, we request the said General Conference to refer the question to the vote of the Annual Conferences and the membership of the Church.

ARRANGING APPOINTMENTS BEFORE CONFERENCE.

Whereas, Our itinerant system of ministration imposes mutual sacrifices on Pastors and people, and these sacrifices both have voluntarily assumed, the Pastor agreeing not to seek his appointment, and the people agreeing not to seek their Pastors ; the wants of each to be provided for by our Bishops ; and

Whereas, The practice now prevails to a considerable extent, of Pastors and charges arranging their appointments before the Conference convenes, thus taking out of the hands of the Bishop his proper function. And whereas, there are still some Pastors and some charges that cannot, in view of their agreement, ask, or negotiate for a particular charge or a particular pastor:

Wherefore, Resolved, 1st., That we respectfully request the ensuing General Conference to iterate the law in relation to appointing Ministers and supplying charges, and annex such penalties as will deter both Pastors and charges from any departure from said rule.

Resolved, 2d., That if in the judgment of the General Conference, the object sought in the foregoing resolution is either impossible or impracticable, the said General Conference then annul the primary rule in relation to appointments, and make all the Pastors and all the charges stand equal before the law—free to make the best negotiation possible.

Whereas, efforts have been made in the city of Philadelphia to enlist the women of the church more actively and systematically in the great work of extending the kingdom of Christ by co-operation with the ministry in giving attention to the children of the church, and to strangers, by visiting the sick and the poor, and by other works of mercy. Therefore,

Resolved, That this Conference regards this movement with deep interest, and that we commend it to the favorable consideration of all our churches.

Resolved, That the photograph albums presented to the Conference at its last session by Rev. J. S. J. McConnell, be placed in the custody of the Philadelphia Conference Historical Society.

LETTER FROM REV. J. T. GRACEY.

To the President and Members of the Philadelphia Annual Conference, to be held in March, 1868.

DEAR FATHERS AND BRETHREN—You will, I am sure, regret to learn that by virtue of domestic affliction I am compelled for a season to leave my work in India.

My wife's health has been declining quite steadily for four years past, and recently she has been so prostrated by a severe illness as to make it imperative that she shall have a change. There is no reasonable ground to believe that she could survive next season in India. The physician has ordered her to sea, in the strong conviction that she may entirely recover by such a change.

I am, in accordance with that professional advice, and by the strong and unanimous judgment of the entire India Mission supporting it, about leaving for America, via England.

We hope to be in the States by midsummer, and further are hoping that, after a short stay at home, and after making arrangements for our two little children to remain there, we may be permitted again to return to India.

We thank you for your kind remembrance of us, for your prayers and sympathy accorded in the past, and ask you kindly not to withdraw these from us in the present need. We may have been poor representatives of your Conference abroad, but with true hearts we hope we have "done what we could." The luxury of labor in the ends of the earth has more than compensated for all that we have endured in this special service.

We gave ourselves to India, and to India we belong. In leaving it temporarily it is only in the hope that we may live longer for India. O pray that God may yet permit us to do much for the peoples of this land. The humblest life assumes an importance when placed in relation with the salvation of a people.

CALCUTTA, INDIA, Dec. 29, 1867.

Resolved, That we have heard, with deep sorrow, of the serious illness of the wife of Rev. John T. Gracey, A.M., which requires him with his family to relinquish for a season their labors in India; and that we will unite with them in asking our Heavenly Father speedily to remove the affliction and grant them upon their return to that promising missionary field a long life of usefulness.

Resolved, That during their temporary sojourn among us we will gladly welcome them to our hearts, our homes and our churches, and we trust that the information they will be able to furnish, in addresses and otherwise, concerning the moral condition and spiritual necessities of India will awaken a profounder interest in the Missionary cause.

Resolved, That at the close of this morning's session the Presiding Bishop be requested to lead the devotions of the Conference, with special reference to Bro. Gracey's family.

ACCOMAC AND NORTHAMPTON, VA.

Whereas, the people of the M. E. Church South have attempted, in the counties of Accomac and Northampton, Va., to take from us unjustly some sixteen church buildings, the probable value of which will exceed \$40,000; and whereas, a suit at law has already been commenced for the recovery of the said property. Therefore,

Resolved, 1. That we, the members of the Philadelphia Annual Conference, do hereby heartily approve of the efforts that loyal people are making to save our property; and,

Resolved, 2. That we deeply sympathize with our people in their troubles in that portion of our work, and do promise to co-operate with our people in sustaining every lawful measure to recover our property.

REV. J. P. DURBIN, D.D.

Whereas, our esteemed fellow-member, the Rev. John P. Durbin, D.D., entered the traveling ministry of the M. E. Church in the year 1819, and therefore now enters upon the fiftieth year of his ministerial life, hale in body, sound in mind, and still abundant in labors; therefore,

Resolved, That this Conference, holding in high estimation the past fidelity and present standing of our beloved brother, and regarding it as a great favor of Providence that he has been so long preserved to the church, respectfully request him at our next annual session to preach before the Conference a semi-centennial sermon.

ON A CHANGE IN THE DISCIPLINE.

Whereas, The Discipline of the M. E. Church provides that a committee for the trial of an accused member shall consist of not less than five, who shall not be members of the Quarterly Conference, and further provides that the Quarterly Conference shall be composed of all the traveling and local preachers, exhorters, stewards, class leaders and trustees of the circuit or station, and the first male superintendent of our Sunday-schools, being members of our Church, and approved by the Quarterly Conference, and thus makes it very difficult, if not sometimes entirely impracticable to obtain a committee of responsible and reliable persons for the trial of an accused member on our circuits, therefore

Resolved, That we, the Philadelphia Annual Conference, recommend the ensuing General Conference to alter the Discipline, by striking out the words in Sec. 5, page 118, "who shall not be members of the Quarterly Conference," and inserting in Section 8, page 128, the words "and no member of the Quarterly Conference having been a member of the committee for the trial of such person shall be permitted to speak or vote on the case."

IN REFERENCE TO SEAMEN'S AID SOCIETY.

Whereas, By calling one-third of His apostles from among seamen, our Lord has taught the Church something of the importance of this class of men as an agency in converting the world; and

Whereas, They are exposed to peculiar perils, and call for special effort on the part of any Christian church, which seeks to do its duty earnestly and faithfully; and

Whereas, The Methodist Episcopal Church has failed heretofore to take her full share in this Christian labor, and ought to employ, in the future, agencies which have not been used in the past; therefore

Resolved, 1st. That we refer this important subject to the General Conference, and recommend such action as they in their wisdom shall deem best for the more effectual prosecution of the work of God among seamen.

Resolved, 2d. That we hereby commend the Pennsylvania Seamen's Friend Society to our members and congregations as an organization which has done, and is still doing much for the Christian welfare of the sailor.

Whereas, the operation of the action of the General Conference, extending the term of ministerial service to three years, and the action of the same body taking off the restriction limiting the stay of Ministers beyond two successive terms in the same city, have operated injuriously upon our economy: therefore,

Resolved, 1. That we do hereby request the ensuing General Conference to re-strict the term of ministerial service to two years, as heretofore.

Resolved, 2. That we also request them to restore the rule prohibiting the appointment of Preachers beyond two consecutive terms in the same city or town.

REV. F. HODGSON, D. D.

Whereas, our highly-esteemed and dearly-beloved brother, Rev. F. Hodgson, D. D., after so long a Conference connection, and so many years of distinguished service among us, is about to leave us for a field of labor not connected with this Conference: therefore,

Resolved, 1. That in the removal, by transfer, of our brother, this Conference has lost a devoted and successful Minister and an able and distinguished Theologian.

Resolved, 2. That we assure our brother of our kindly feeling and the high regard which we entertain for him, and that should he, in the providence of God, be restored to us, we will extend to him a hearty welcome.

Resolved, 3. That we commend him to the affectionate regard and highest consideration of the brethren of the East Baltimore Conference and of the church to which he shall be appointed.

ANTI-TOBACCO RESOLUTIONS.

Whereas, This Conference has declared that "In its judgment the chewing and smoking of tobacco is a needless self-indulgence; therefore,

Resolved, 1. That we commend its action to the Christian regard of the members of the church within our bounds.

Resolved, 2. That as Pastors it is our duty to set "the flock over which the Holy Ghost hath made us overseers," an example of holy self-denial, by abstaining from the use of tobacco.

RESOLUTIONS OF THANKS.

Resolved, That the thanks of this Conference are due, and are hereby tendered, to the reporters, for their faithful services during our session.

Resolved, That the thanks of this Conference are hereby tendered to Rev. S. W. Thomas and Rev. G. D. Carrow for their attention to the comfort of the Conference, and also to the Managers of the Tract Society.

Resolved, That the thanks of this Conference are due, and are herein presented to, the Trustees of the Union Church for the use of the building, and to the families who have so kindly entertained us during the session of this Conference.

Resolved, That the thanks of this Conference are due, and are hereby tendered to the President and Directors of the Philadelphia, Wilmington and Baltimore, Penn. Central, Reading, and Northern Central Railroads, for their liberal arrangements made with the members of this Conference and visitors on business.

Whereas, there is need of a new M. E. Church at Greensborough; and whereas, that society have recently been deprived of a bequest of over \$3,000, by a decision of the Court of Appeals of the State of Maryland, thus depriving them of the necessary means of commencing the enterprise: therefore,

Resolved, That we commend said church to the sympathy and material aid of the people within the bounds of this Conference.

Whereas the discipline of the M. E. Church provides that a committee for the trial of an accused member shall consist of not less than five, who shall not be members of the Quarterly Conference, and further provides that the Quarterly Conference shall be composed of all the Traveling and Local Preachers, exhorters, stewards, class leaders, and trustees of the churches in the circuit or station, and the first male superintendents of our Sunday Schools, being members of our Church and approved by the Quarterly Conference, and thus makes it very diffi-

cult, if not sometimes entirely impracticable, to obtain a committee of responsible and reliable persons for the trial of an accused member on our circuits, therefore,

Resolved, That we, the Philadelphia Annual Conference, recommend the ensuing General Conference to alter the Discipline by striking out the words, in section 5, page 118, "who shall not be members" of the Quarterly Conference, and inserting in section 8, page 128, the words, "and no member of the Quarterly Conference, having been a member of the Committee for the trial of such person shall be permitted to speak or vote on the case."

RULES

FOR THE GOVERNMENT OF THE PHILADELPHIA ANNUAL CONFERENCE.

I. OF THE DUTIES OF THE PRESIDENT.

1. The President shall see that all the business appertaining to the Conference shall be brought forward and conducted in a proper manner, according to the provisions of the discipline, and the rules of the Conference.

2. He shall preserve order in all the proceedings—and in debate shall keep the speakers to the question, and call them to order when they wander from the point, or from the rules of order, or use ~~any~~ improper language.

3. He shall decide all questions of order; nevertheless any two members may appeal from his decision to the Conference, and in such case the appeal shall be decided without debate.

4. He shall appoint all committees, unless otherwise directed by the Conference, in which case the appointment shall be made by ballot or nomination, at the discretion of the Conference; no member thereof being permitted to nominate more than one person for the same committee.

5. Where two or more members arise and address the President at the same time, he shall decide which of them is entitled to the floor.

II. THE DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY.

1. The Secretary shall keep a fair and correct record of the proceedings of the Conference, to be read at the commencement of each session thereof, subject to correction by the Conference.

2. He shall carefully preserve the journals and papers of the Conference placed in his custody, and shall not permit any person but a member to examine the same, nor shall he allow a member to make a transcript from either without the permission of the Conference, and he shall also produce the journals and papers at the next annual session of the Conference.

3. He shall also after the close of the Conference make an appendix at the end of the journal, in which he shall record all documents which shall be ordered by the Conference to be so recorded, (the motion on which shall be taken without debate,) and the documents so recorded shall be referred to on the Journal of Conference.

III. THE DUTIES AND PRIVILEGES OF MEMBERS.

1. Every member who would speak shall rise in his place and respectfully address the President, restraining from all personalities or indecorous language, but no member shall speak more than once to the same question (except to explain) until every member choosing shall have spoken, nor longer than fifteen minutes, without permission of the Conference.

2. When a member shall be called to order by the President or any member, he shall take his seat until the question be decided by the President; nevertheless he shall be allowed an appeal to the Conference, which shall decide without debate.

3. Any member may call for the division of a question, which shall be granted when in the judgment of the President the sense will admit of it, and every member present shall vote on all questions unless excused by the Conference.

IV. QUESTIONS TO BE TAKEN WITHOUT DEBATE.

1. A motion simply to adjourn.
2. A motion to lie on the table.

V. PROMISCUOUS RULES.

1. A motion to adjourn shall be always in order.

2. When a question has been decided, any member who may have voted in the majority on said question may move for a reconsideration thereof.

3. When the reading of a paper is called for, and the same is objected to by a member, the question shall be determined by a vote of the Conference.

4. When a motion is made and seconded, and entertained by the President, it shall be deemed to be in the possession of the Conference, but may be withdrawn at any time by the mover, with the consent of the seconder, before a decision had thereon, or an amendment thereto be entertained by the President.

5. It shall be in order any time during the discussion of a proposition before the Conference (except during the examination of character) to move that the question shall be taken without further debate, and, if sustained by a majority of the members present, it shall be immediately put and decided.

6. No motion shall be entertained unless seconded, and all motions and resolutions shall be reduced to writing, if desired by the President or Secretary, or any member of Conference.

7. No matter of business, other than that which pertains to the ordinary business of the Conference, shall be read by the Secretary, until the subject of it is stated by the introducer.

8. In discussion upon a report of a committee, the Chairman of the committee whose report is under consideration or such member of the committee as the committee may agree upon, shall be entitled to the last speech upon the question.



REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGERS.

In presenting the Forty-Seventh Annual Report of the Missionary Society of the M. E. Church within the bounds of the Philadelphia Conference, your Managers can say but little that will differ from the almost stereotyped remarks heretofore used in regard to the operations of the Society or its annual meetings. Being only an incorporated agent for receiving and handing over to the Parent Society at New York the moneys raised within the limits of the Conference for Missionary purposes, they must refer you, for the application of those funds and the grand results they are designed to secure, to the report of that Parent Board.

They, however, have great pleasure in declaring their entire confidence in the wisdom and effectiveness of the administration of the Board at New York, and believe a more general familiarity with its doings and the work it has accomplished, and the unceasing progress and expanding influence of its energies, would greatly stimulate the Church in its activity and liberality in behalf of this good cause.

The Anniversary, always the occasion of much anxiety in preparing for it, and invariably exciting the highest solicitude of the Managers and the friends of Missions, for its effect, was held on the evening of March 16th, during the session of the Conference, in Horticultural Hall, one of the largest of our public buildings, and was filled to its utmost capacity.

The chair was taken at $7\frac{1}{2}$ o'clock by General ALBRIGHT, of Mauch Chunk, Pa. The music was under the direction of Professor FISCHER, and for such an occasion could hardly be excelled.

The Treasurer's report showed an increase of nearly five thousand dollars over the receipts of the previous year.

The Rev. H. A. CLEVELAND, one of the comparatively young men of the Conference, was introduced as the first speaker. He delivered an address that kindled much enthusiasm, and abounded with important and impressive thoughts, and met with a cordial and gracious response from the vast audience. Rev. O. H. TIFFANY, of New Brunswick, N. J., was the next speaker, whose address was replete with fitness, and sparkled throughout with gems of grandest thoughts, and conclusions of highest import.

Dr. DURBIN, than whom none enjoys more eminently the confidence and affection of the churches in Philadelphia, in a very few plain and practical remarks, addressed himself more particularly to the ladies, inviting them to increased activity, and even to some sacrifice, in behalf of the great Missionary cause.

We reckoned the meeting a grand success, and all, with grateful hearts and

stronger convictions, united in singing the old Doxology, and receiving the parting blessing and Apostolic benediction from the venerable Father BOEHM, separated to do much better this year than even the last for this holy cause.

It is wonderful how the intense interest in our annual meetings is maintained. So much has been said, so well and so often, and almost invariably leaving the conviction that the like can never be again: yet each succeeding one seems to measure fully up to any that went before—and, indeed, makes the impression that it was the best of all. And so we regard this last—a great religious popular meeting, of the grandest style.

For several years past the want of a Life Membership Certificate, combining in its subject expression and artistic appropriateness to the object and character of the Conference Missionary Society, has been a pressing need. The plate on which our late certificates were printed was so entirely worn out as to utterly fail in giving satisfaction, as a picture, to those entitled to receive them; while, as a design to represent the great aim of the Society, it seemed to be entirely voiceless, and the demand for something new and befitting became general and loud. Under this pressure your Managers, through a committee appointed for the purpose, authorized a very talented artist, Mr. D. R. KNIGHT, of this city, to prepare a painting which in all respects should combine those traits and attributes essential to such an object. That picture, to which has been devoted the best energies of the artist through about ten months of the past year, was completed just in time to be on exhibition during the session of the Conference, and, so far as your Managers know, secured the approval of all (and there were very many) who examined it. It is yet to be engraved and prepared for printing the certificates, which we hope will be accomplished, and the certificates be ready for delivery by the meeting of the next Conference.

It is a source of regret to your Managers that the necessity for this new certificate, involving, as it does, a heavy expenditure, should have occurred just when Missionary Funds were most needed, and the Parent Treasury so entirely exhausted, (and, indeed, in debt,) as to suggest and require the most stringent management of its funds. We have, however, reason to believe the work once done will do its full share in stimulating the Church, where these certificates may become known to an increased liberality: and, by the sale of the picture itself when the Society no longer needs it, return all its cost to the treasury.

In view of the growing interest in the Missionary cause within the bounds of the Conference, and the growing ability of our people to enlarge their contributions, and the great beauty of the new certificate we are preparing to bring out, it has occurred to some of us that higher figures might be fixed as the condition of life membership; or, following the example of the Parent Board, create one or two higher grades of distinction, (such as Life Director or Life Patron of the Conference Society,) at the price of such higher contributions as may be deemed right—and though the certificate for each be of the same character, yet so vary in their size as to bear some proportion to the higher amount fixed on as the condition of the honor the certificate may indicate.

All of which is respectfully submitted.
